





A Plan for Increasing Postsecondary Credentials to Fuel a Strong Economy

1. FOCUS ON READINESS	Higher education and K-12 will work together to develop and implement a strategy that seeks to identify students not on target to be college-ready by graduation and targets activities in the 11 th and 12 th grades to reduce remediation demands in the transition from high school to college.
2. TRANSFORM REMEDIATION	Every Oklahoma institution will implement transformational models of remedial placement and support through a statewide phased implementation and refinement process.
3. BUILD BRIDGES TO CERTIFICATES & JOBS	Develop and implement a "Program Equivalent Project" that bridges Career Tech credit hour completion to certificate and A.A.S. degree completion in the community colleges.
4. REACH HIGHER FOR ADULT COMPLETION	Further expand and develop <i>Reach Higher</i> as a degree and certificate completion effort that involves the entire system of postsecondary education.
5. TRACK & REWARD PROGRESS & COMPLETION	Reform Oklahoma's successful <i>Brain Gain Performance Funding Program</i> to provide metrics and accountability for measuring state and campus progress toward completion goals.




It's working...

- Since our transition to offering remediation, zero level math pass rates have gone from 47 to 78 percent.
 - A 31 Percent Improvement!
- Students are only needing one remedial class and over 75 percent are passing the first time

Remedial Education at UCO

IS 12-050 Executive Summary

- In 1991, the State Regents adopted and implemented the “*Policy Statement on the Assessment of Students for Purposes of Instructional Improvement and State System Accountability*,” which requires Oklahoma’s public higher education institutions to administer comprehensive assessment programs. The policy was modified in 1993, with remediation made mandatory for under-prepared students and requires institutions to use an ACT score of 19 in the subject areas of English, mathematics, science reasoning, and reading as the “first cut” in determining whether a student needs remediation. Students scoring below 19 in an ACT subject area must either enroll in a remedial course or undergo secondary assessment.
- ACT subscores <19 require taking our Course Placement Test (CPT), which is The College Board’s Accuplacer system.
- Students needing remediation has dramatically increased over the past 5 years.
- The Oklahoma State Regents of Higher Education mandate that students at Oklahoma universities will take three credit hours of mathematics during their undergraduate career.
- Last week, OSRHE sponsored a Math Faculty Conference at Central with a keynote presentation by Uri Treisman, University of Texas. His key emphasis was on shortening the time for students to reach the college level in mathematics.
- Roughly two-thirds of all undergraduate programs at UCO use the “Mathematics for General Education” course while the remaining third (primarily in the sciences and business) require College Algebra.
- Central has created different tracks to assist students in remediating their deficiency in a faster and more effective manner.
- Since our transition to offering Remedial courses again, the success rates of students in zero level math classes have increased from approximately 47 to 78 percent. Students are now reaching college level mathematics in a more expeditious and economical manner.


Former Remediation Process:
