of the State of Oklahoma

Nineteenth Legislative Day, Thursday, March 9, 2006

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Winchester.

The roll was called with 97 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Adkins, Armes, Johnson, Morgan (Fred).—4.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Steve Lance, Noble Assembly of God Church, Noble.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

REMARKS

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Miller (Doug) the remarks of Pastor Lance were printed in full as follows:

“Today’s devotion is entitled ‘The Recipe For Blessing’. The word ‘blessed’ means happy, prosperous. How many of you want to be blessed? How many of you want our great State of Oklahoma to be blessed?

Psalm 33:12-22 gives us ‘The Recipe for Blessing’

12 Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord, the people he chose for his inheritance.

13 From heaven the Lord looks down and sees all mankind;

14 from his dwelling place he watches all who live on earth--

15 he who forms the hearts of all, who considers everything they do.

16 No king is saved by the size of his army; no warrior escapes by his great strength.

17 A horse is a vain hope for deliverance; despite all its great strength it cannot save.

18 But the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, on those whose hope is in his unfailing love,

19 to deliver them from death and keep them alive in famine.

20 We wait in hope for the Lord; he is our help and our shield.

21 In him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in his holy name.

22 May your unfailing love rest upon us, O Lord, even as we put our hope in you.

I'm not much of a cook, but I believe I can follow a recipe and end up with something decent to eat. Several years ago, the men of our church were challenged to a soup contest. Each man was to bring a soup that he made, totally on his own. I got my wife's recipe book and began looking for something I could enter. I found a recipe for corn chowder and got after it. As I said, I'm not a cook at all, but I did my best to follow the recipe. Guess What? I took first place! Everyone loved it. There was only one casualty. The lid to the pot I cooked the soup in. While the soup was on the stove, I turned the fire off to let it cool so I could take it to the church. When I went to remove the lid a few moments later it was sucked down tight on the pot. I pulled and pulled and twisted and huffed and puffed and to my own amazement I began bending up the metal lid. I can't remember if I actually got it off or if that's when Carol came in and turned the heat back on and the vacuum was released and the lid came right off. We've still got that pot with the dented up lid.

Here's the point to this illustration:

By following the recipe, even an inexperienced cook can make a great award-winning corn chowder.

In comparison to God's might and wisdom, we are all inexperienced, though we may believe we are all pretty sharp people. And I believe we are, or we wouldn't be serving in our positions.

But the Bible says in I Cor. 1:25 'The foolishness of God is wiser than man's wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than man's strength.' So God is infinitely wiser and stronger than we are yet He gives us the recipe for being blessed and we can follow that.

Our Founding Fathers respected and followed this recipe and in so doing, laid the groundwork for the greatest and most blessed nation on earth. 'In God Trust' was their motto and 'One Nation Under God' was their pledge. Through the years, in spite of God's hand upon us, some of our leaders think they have a better recipe for blessing than God's recipe. They believe that the size of the army and the strength of the economy is enough to save us and bring us blessing. Yet, I have to tell you, that our own strength and wisdom are a vain hope for deliverance and blessing. We must do what the Lord says.

God's recipe still works!

His eyes are on those who follow and fear Him to deliver them from death and keep us in times of famine.

In II Kings, chapter 4, there is a woman whose husband died and her creditors were coming to take her two boys as slaves until her debts were paid. She tells Elisha, the prophet, about it and he asks her 'what do you have in your house?' She says nothing but a little oil. He tells her to go around and ask all her neighbors for empty jars and don't ask for just a few. Then go inside your house, shut the door behind you and your sons and start pouring oil into the jars and as each one is filled, put it aside. So she did, just as he said. She followed his recipe for blessing. The oil kept flowing until not one jar was left and then it stopped. She then went and told Elisha the result and he told her. 'Go, sell the oil and pay your debts. You and your sons can live on what is left.'

Isn't that a great story? By following the Lord's recipe she was blessed. She found happiness and prosperity along with hope, help and a shield.

God's principles, nor God Himself ever change. God worked then and He will work now if...we follow His recipe.

The other point of my cooking illustration is that even though we may not have all the answers and find ourselves wrestling with difficult and perplexing issues, if we keep the fire on, the fire of God that is, He will keep us from getting bent out of shape and getting weary and worn out in the struggle.

Isaiah 40:31 says... 'Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not be weary, they will walk and not be faint.'

We can expect His unfailing love to rest upon us."
