Twenty-fourth Legislative Day, Thursday, March 16, 2006

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Winchester.

The roll was called with 99 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Hastings, Shumate.—2.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Minister Brent Franks, Antlers Church of Christ, Antlers. Minister Franks was sponsored by Representative Pruett.

Upon motion of Representative Miller (Doug), Minister Franks was confirmed as House Chaplain for this legislative day.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

REMARKS

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Pruett, the remarks of Minister Franks were ordered printed in full as follows:

“As Lawmakers and Representatives of the people of the great state of Oklahoma, you have a great responsibility filled with great opportunity. You have been chosen by your constituents to guide and protect their interests and freedom. You’ve been granted the right to make decisions for the people. You’ve been entrusted with our present and future.

What an awe inspiring task for an ordinary human. Yet you are not alone in your endeavor. The Creator of the universe, the one who has granted certain unalienable rights to all mankind stands by your side. The Apostle Paul writes to the Romans in chapter thirteen “Let every person be subject to the governing authorities; for there is no authority except from God, and those authorities that exist have been instituted by God.” It is noteworthy that Paul said this about an evil Roman government that would soon put him to

death! The Apostle Peter echoed these admonitions in I Peter 2:13ff, writing during the time of Emperor Nero, a vicious persecutor of the Christians.

So what does this mean for you! Today? It means that you are God's servant, enabled and strengthened by him to lead and to guide. It also means that many are praying for you every day, asking God almighty to give you wisdom, integrity and strength. It is humbling, yet empowering to know that your name has been spoken in the throne room of the Creator. To know that God has acted on your behalf. Alexis De Tocqueville, writing about democracy in America, said America is great because America is good, when America ceases to be good, it will cease to be great." Keep Oklahoma great, keep Oklahoma good. People are praying for you. God is listening and acting, you are God's servant."
