

# HOUSE JOURNAL

**Second Regular Session of the Fiftieth Legislature**

**of the State of Oklahoma**

**Forty-fourth Legislative Day, Thursday, April 20, 2006**

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Winchester.

The roll was called with 97 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Billy, Cox, Nance, Newport.—4.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Associate Pastor Neil Franks, Council Road Baptist Church, Bethany.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

## **REMARKS**

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Wesselhoft, the remarks of Pastor Franks were ordered printed in full as follows:

“Madame Speaker, esteemed representatives, guests of the house. It has been my pleasure to serve you in some small way this week. I appreciate greatly the warm welcome I have received. I would like to thank Rep. Ray Young for the invitation to come. I admire you greatly. It truly has been an honor to be among you each day and one I will not soon forget.

On this final day I understand I have a few minutes to address you. Asking a preacher to speak only for a few minutes is a dangerous thing, much like asking the wolf to take only one chicken from the henhouse. But respecting the rules of order and recognizing the need for brevity I have spent quite some time trying to determine what should be the topic of my address to you.

I first thought about sharing how through careful observation that I have come to realize that we preachers (particularly those of us from a Baptist tradition), and you as state

representatives may not be so different after all. I mean lock any two of us in a room and give us a topic, any topic at all, and in ten minutes we can leave that room with 3 different opinions. Or how some of us can talk for 30 minutes and never really say all that much. We also share the inability to make any decision without a committee meeting. Here too, I have noticed that it is the administrative assistants who really run the show, we simply do what we are told. We further share the benefit of having thousands of people who know how to do our jobs better than we do, and lest we forget they call us often to remind us. We both prefer being dressed up than dressed down, and while others may simply see a crowd of people, we always see opportunity.

But then I thought, no, that would be an insult to compare your position to that of a preacher. So then I wondered, maybe I should spend my time warning you of the inherent dangers of power and how power can lead to corruption. I could read to you I Corinthians 15:33 which says, "Do not be misled, bad company, corrupts good character." But somehow that just seemed a little too preachy.

Then the thought occurred, maybe I should remind you of your responsibility to the people. Only when government is of the people, by the people and for the people can we truly remain a civilized culture, I could say. An idea, by the way, taken directly from the Scripture for in the book of Philippians 2 we are told to... "do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves." Or I could point out I Chronicles 19 to you. A reminder that the decisions you make in this place will be evaluated not just by your constituents, but by God himself one day. He will judge with no partiality nor injustice. But again, I thought, too preachy.

So then I thought maybe I could call you to something higher than merely the pursuit of power or position or fame. I could read to you 2 Peter 1:5 where it says..."We should, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love. If you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." But, that surely sounded preachy so I chose not to speak of it.

So then I thought, well maybe I could remind you, whether you realize it or not, that preachers and politicians both are in the "ministry". We are all ministers of God. Romans chapter 13 says so. You minister through legislating punishment for those who do wrong and through legislation rewarding those who do right. But I did not think I would have enough time to fully explore that line of Biblical reasoning.

So this morning, after thinking about all of these possible topics upon which to speak, I never could decide what to say to you.

So would you simply stand and join me in prayer.

God I thank you for every individual in this room. You created every one of us in your image. And you love us with a love we cannot even imagine. You desire a personal relationship with each of us. Regardless of color or creed or culture, our past, present or future you reach out to us. You sent your own son to pay for our sin, so that you can forgive us all of our transgressions. I pray that if anyone here has never found that life giving relationship with Jesus, they would seek it and discover a spiritual community in which to grow.

I thank you for the sacrifice of these who give their lives to the calling of public service. May those of us who live outside these walls be ever faithful, ever supportive and ever prayerful on their behalf. In the name of Jesus Christ, I ask these things. AMEN."
