While I support including under the Oklahoma Governmental Tort Claims Act doctors who contract with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority to perform administrative duties such as reviewing medical charts, this legislation is overly broad and ambiguous and is covered elsewhere in the Act.

I have signed House Bill 2103 and have caused same to be filed with the Office of the Secretary of State. Although a tuition lock program was part of the overall budget agreement between the executive and legislative branches, I have serious concerns about the long-term impact of the language contained in this measure. I want to ensure that this legislation does not inadvertently result in higher tuition rates for all students or adversely affect the financial health and quality of colleges and universities, especially during an economic downturn. This legislation does not take effect until the 2008-2009 school year, and I look forward to working with legislative leaders to address these issues in the next

legislative session so there are no detrimental effects on the higher education system or the students it serves.
