## MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of the following engrossed measures.

The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

**SB 41** – By Corn of the Senate and Lamons of the House.

[intoxicating liquors - changing name of license - effective date]

**SB 70** – By Ballenger and Crutchfield of the Senate and Hyman of the House.

An Act relating to agriculture; creating the Feral Swine Control Act; stating purpose; defining terms; specifying license and permit requirements; authorizing removal of feral swine; authorizing the promulgation of rules and establishment of fees; establishing importation requirements; making certain activities unlawful; providing for penalties; providing for emergency orders of the State Veterinarian; amending 4 O.S. 2001, Sections 85.1, 85.2, 98 and 99, which relate to estrays and the enclosure of animals; modifying definitions; modifying procedures; modifying penalties; amending 29 O.S. 2001, Section 4-135, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 193, O.S.L. 2004 (29 O.S. Supp. 2006, Section 4-135), which relates to permits to control nuisance or damage by wildlife; deleting requirement for hunting feral hogs at night; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**SB 129** – By Corn of the Senate and Peterson (Ron) of the House.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 6-117, as last amended by Section 6, Chapter 204, O.S.L. 2006 (47 O.S. Supp. 2006, Section 6-117), which relates to records to be kept by the Department of Public Safety; authorizing the Commissioner to establish a procedure for producing certain reports; authorizing the Department to sell such reports to insurance companies for a fee; requiring such reports be otherwise lawfully obtainable; establishing fee guidelines; directing fee deposit; and providing an effective date.

**SB 145** – By Crain of the Senate and Sullivan of the House.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2001, Sections 1272, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 465, O.S.L. 2003, and 1277 (21 O.S. Supp. 2006, Section 1272), which relate to unlawful carry; allowing certain judges to carry weapons under specified circumstances; and providing an effective date.

**SB 609** – By Sweeden of the Senate and Adkins of the House.

An Act relating to the Corporation Commission; amending 17 O.S. 2001, Section 251, which relates to fuel adjustment clauses; modifying certain method of inventory accounting for fuel in storage; and providing an effective date.

**SB 712** – By Williamson of the Senate and Tibbs of the House.

An Act relating to contracts; stating legislative finding; stating intent; creating the Anti-Caller ID Spoofing Act; providing short title; defining terms; prohibiting certain insertion of false information into a caller identification system; providing exemptions; providing penalties; making certain actions violations of the Oklahoma Consumer Protection Act; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**SB 734** – By Morgan, Gumm and Bingman of the Senate and Adkins of the House.

An Act relating to electric service; declaring legislative intent relating to study of certain issues relating to retail electric consumer choice in this state; creating the Joint Electric Utility Restructuring Task Force; stating membership; providing for officers and meetings; stating requirements for study; providing for travel reimbursement; providing for staffing; authorizing reports and recommendations; providing for termination; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.
