NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows: It is the intent of the Legislature that, immediately after the effective date of this act, the board of regents for each institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education adopt a student housing policy that gives all students, regardless of their enrollment status or financial ability, the option to live in institution-owned on-campus housing or reside off campus while enrolled in the institution. In addition, the policy shall not require a student to apply for a waiver or exemption from an on-campus housing requirement to live off campus.”
