Fifth Legislative Day, Thursday, February 8, 2007

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Blackwell.

The roll was called with 101 Members present.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Reverend Tim Woods, Edmond.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

REMARKS

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Piatt, the remarks of Reverend Tim Woods were ordered printed as follows:

“I have thoroughly enjoyed serving as the Chaplain this week. I would like to thank you for this privilege, most especially Speaker Cargill. It was about fourteen years ago that Lance Cargill first walked into my house... and I never fathomed that some day I would visit him in this House... It’s been fun. Thanks again, Lance! I appreciate your friendship.

In 1780, William Wilberforce was elected to Parliament at the age of twenty-one. He was wealthy. He was well educated. He was witty. Wilberforce was considered a leading orator of his day. However, this young statesman traded it all for the challenge of his life: the eradication of slavery within the British Empire.

William Wilberforce introduced legislation again and again and again and again. He stood against public opinion. He stood against party opposition. His inspiration was a devout devotion to Christ and a disregard for personal convenience.

After two decades, 20 years, Parliament passed the bill to end the British slave trade. It is recorded that Wilberforce sat at his desk in the House of Commons with his head in his hands, tears streaming down his face.

But then, for the next 26 years, Wilberforce devoted the rest of his life to ending slavery around the world. In fact, he was on his deathbed when he was informed that Parliament had emancipated all slaves in every British colony. Three days later, Wilberforce died.

I am an avid student of history. So... several years ago, when I came across William Wilberforce, I was perplexed, I was confused. *I had never heard of him.* I never studied him in school. I never read of him in college.

In fact, if you look through a World History Book like this one – it contains over a thousand pages, weighs about five pounds, and is sanctioned for Oklahoma Secondary Schools. You won't find William Wilberforce one time. The man who is known as "the Washington of Humanity." The man who inspired Abraham Lincoln.

Sometimes we wonder – How will I be remembered? Will my memory be etched in history? Will my portrait hang on a wall? Will my name be included in a book? However, it matters not what man's books say about us. It matters what God's book says.

The Bible declares that God is keeping track – not just of our voting record – but of our actions, our words, our thoughts, the motives and the intents of the heart. It's in times like these I realize... I need a Savior.

William Wilberforce knew that he needed a Savior. He was reminded many times of this fact by his friend, a minister who happened to be a former slave trader. His name was John Newton.

Perhaps you've not heard of John Newton, but you've probably heard a little verse he penned,

*Amazing grace,
How sweet the sound
That saved a wretch like me
I once was lost, but now am found
'Twas blind, but now I see*

Let us pray,

O Lord,
Today we need your grace...
To wash away our sins, our shortcomings, our failures
We ask you to be our Lord, our Savior
May our blinded eyes see your truth
May we fight for justice
May we stand for righteousness
Unpopular though it may be
Give us the strength to endure
Not that we might be included within the History Books
But that we might be included in Your Book,
O God, our great redeemer!
We ask it in your name... Amen"
