Second Regular Session of the Fifty-first Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Seventeenth Legislative Day, Monday, March 3, 2008

HB 2242 by Ingmire of the House and Crutchfield of the Senate was read and considered.

Representative Morrisette moved to amend **HB 2242**, by adding new Sections 2 and 3 to read as follows:

“SECTION 2. A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9040 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Director of the Department of Human Services shall, prior to July 1, 2008, prepare several different plans for the transfer of administration of the Children and Family Services Division, the Aging Services Division, and the Development Disabilities Services Division to a separate and independent agency for each division. The transition plans shall include provisions for the transfer, reassignment, and retraining of employees affected by the transfer. The Director shall use any and all internal budgetary resources to prepare said plans.

B. The transition plans shall be submitted to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on or before November 1, 2009.

SECTION 3. This act shall become affective November 1, 2009.”

Representative Wright asked a ruling of the Presiding Officer whether the Morrisette amendment was germane to **HB 2242**.
