“D. Beginning November 1, 2008, all new construction or alterations to buildings or facilities:

1. Which require a building permit and are open to public use shall provide and maintain an automatic door in accordance with this section;
2. Which require a building permit, are open to public use, and are two (2) or more stories shall provide and maintain at least one handicapped accessible restroom with an automatic door on each floor; and
3. Which require a building permit, and are open to public use shall follow the requirements set forth by the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal and the most recent publication of the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines.”

Representative Gilbert moved to amend the amendment, by striking “D.”, which amendment was declared adopted.
