## Second Regular Session of the Fifty-first Legislature

### of the State of Oklahoma

#### Thirty-first Legislative Day, Thursday, March 27, 2008

The House was called to order by Speaker Bengé.

The roll was called with 99 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Peterson (Ron), Worthen.—2.

The Speaker declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Jason L. Ewing, Zion Church, Weatherford.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

#### REMARKS

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Covey, the remarks of Pastor Ewing were ordered printed as follows:

“It has been said that if you give a person a fish you feed a person for a day. If you teach a person to fish you feed a person for a lifetime.

I believe one of the areas the church struggles with is in the area of deciding between feeding a person a fish and teaching a person to fish. My response to this is to ask the question: ‘Should the church be trying to make this choice in the first place?’ When Jesus asks Simon Peter the question, ‘Do you love me?’ on each of the three separate occasions the question is followed by a command. Most probably understand the command from Jesus to Peter (who is the representation of the church—that is the universal church), as simply to, ‘feed my sheep.’ However, after a careful look at the Greek text we can see that there is a distinction. In the three commands, there are actually two different words used. While both words can vaguely be translated as ‘feed’ my sheep; the translation does not help us understand the specific intent of Jesus’ command. Jesus does in fact command Peter twice to ‘Feed my Sheep’ which is better understood as the first command and the third command. But, after asking Peter a second time, ‘Simon do you love me?’ Peter’s

affirmative response is followed by the command from Jesus to ‘Shepherd my sheep’ or ‘Tend my Sheep.’

To state it more plainly in relation to my previous question (Should the church spend energy deciding between feeding a person a fish or teaching a person to fish?) the commands of Jesus make it clear that we are to feed the sheep AND care for the sheep. Consequently, the Church (and I mean the universal church that is made up of the entirety of body of believers) is commanded to not choose between feeding a fish and teaching to fish—but instead do both simultaneously! This is what it means when Jesus says, ‘FEED my sheep’ and ‘TEND my sheep.’ To say it another way, the Church is commanded by Jesus to address the physical needs of the sheep and enable them to feed for themselves.

Since we understand Jesus’ command to the Church—not just the pastors and the deacons, but all believers from all places at all times—it is appropriate to occasionally evaluate the performance of the church in general by asking, ‘How well are we *feeding* the sheep AND how well are we *tending* the sheep?’ As a minister for the last 18 years, I have seen occasions where the church has risen to the moment and been successful at accomplishing both. And while I’m sure many of your churches can boast of a job well done in both FEEDING and TENDING, I fear that the Church, in general, is becoming increasingly void if not completely void from these two crucial activities. And the consequence of the overall neglect by the church has left the sheep to look elsewhere to meet their basic needs. And I stand before you today to confess that because of the churches’ inability to consistently and passionately pursue the supremacy and glory of God by actively loving our neighbors, the job of feeding and tending the sheep has been left to our various government and civil entities to pick up the slack.

More times than you can probably count, this chamber has deliberated on bills and laws in the areas related to: feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, compassion toward the fatherless children, mending the sick, helping those imprisoned, caring for the poor, supporting the disabled, tending to the elderly and widows, and a host of many other requests. The irony is that many of these concerns that this House deliberates upon are actually concerns that the Church is scripturally mandated to address. Because the Church as a whole has failed more times than it has succeeded, this chamber and many like it around our nation has been forced to do what the Church should be doing more actively: Feeding and Tending our sheep!

As I stated earlier, you may be able to boast that your local visible church is the exception to my remarks. I say ‘Amen!’ And I would agree that there are ministries that are busy about feeding and tending the sheep. But whatever the Church is doing right, it is evident that it is not nearly enough. Our society needs to see a shift in our cultural reaction. Today, when a person has a need, one will confidently stroll into a civil building and get the necessary assistance without much difficulty. Instead, we should hope for a day that when there is a person in need we will find that the whole Church would adhere to what is scripturally mandated and meet those needs in increasing waves. I pray for a day that when a person requires long term benefits related to housing or food or whatever the benevolent case may be—that this person in our society, whether they are active in our church or not, would begin to feel confident and secure enough to walk through the church doors to seek assistance and get it. Hopefully this would happen long before the need to visit any one of the various government or civic entities is necessary. And perhaps a real miracle waits to be discovered when churches would begin to do such an adequate job in addressing these benevolent needs that the demands from many of our government sponsored programs would be less burdened each and every day.

I've heard someone describe a circus coming to town and announcing their arrival with a parade through town. You'd see the acrobats and magicians and animals all strolling down the roadway. And toward the end you would perhaps see the elephants and behind the elephants you would find the clowns. And careful observation would see the clowns following behind cleaning up after the elephants. It seems to me that in some cases the Church has become more like a circus. We try to fill the tents with the greatest programs and modern spiritual gimmicks to keep a house full. The Church announces its presence in the community parading around trying to draw a huge crowd only now it is the elephants that are cleaning up after the clowns. This is because the sheep are not adequately fed nor tended.

I share my concerns with you with a sad heart. And I share my concerns with you with a heart of gratitude. I'm grateful for the work that you do and intend to do in the areas of meeting the benevolent needs of our great state. And my heart is sad to have to confess to you that the Church is not doing its part. We must expect more from the Church. We must ask the church to rise to the occasion more and more. We must ask the Church to keep reaching out and to never be satisfied with 'doing enough!' And until that day comes, I ask that you distinguished individuals keep doing the job you're doing with patience and excellence. And in the meantime, let's challenge our churches to do more. Let's challenge our churches to work together. Let's challenge our churches to embrace the biblical mandate to tend AND feed the sheep. And one day, maybe we will see these circuses finally take their tents down and move on down the road. I am hopeful this can begin here in Oklahoma. I am hopeful that it can begin with me. I am hopeful to the glory of God."
