Second Regular Session of the Fifty-first Legislature

of the State of Oklahoma

Thirty-fifth Legislative Day, Thursday, April 3, 2008

The House was called to order by Speaker Bengé.

The roll was called with 100 Members present.

The following Member was excused: Cargill.—1.

The Speaker declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Mark Stapp, Cherokee Hills Baptist Church, Oklahoma City. Pastor Stapp was sponsored by Representative Thompson.

Upon motion of Representative Thompson, Pastor Stapp was confirmed as House Chaplain for this legislative day.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

REMARKS

Upon motion of Representative Thompson, Pastor Stapp's remarks were ordered printed as follows:

"I would like to start by posing a question this morning. In fact, it would be interesting and insightful to be able to sit down with each one of you individually and hear your story, as it relates to this question.

The question is simply this: '*Why are you here?*' And by that I mean, what caused you to pursue a career in politics? What motivates you to get up in the morning and do what you do here? What compels you to serve your constituents in this way?

- Is it the honor and prestige of the office? For some that may be true, but I would trust for most, it is a higher calling than that.

- Is it the power and authority ... or the perks that come with the office?

Again probably not for most.

- Is it the pay check? Pay checks definitely come in handy, but if it is something you're impassioned about, you would probably be doing it even if you didn't get paid. In fact, I read recently that *'In a given year it is estimated that American adults volunteer roughly 20 billion hours of their time.'* That's one of the things that makes America so great. You stack up the United States of America with any other country, and America is the most benevolent and compassionate in the world. That's why when 9-1-1, or the Oklahoma Bombing, or when flooding (both nationally and internationally) devastates a land, the people of the United States are the first responders ... not for a pay check, but because we are passionate about helping people.

What caused you to choose this career path?

- Was it the aspiration to change your world? ... to change a policy you felt was unfair? ... to get done what you have perceived as being left undone? ... to address a wrong, and help make it right? ... to make this a safer and better place to live – for you, your children, your grandchildren?

Why are you here?

I have been in the ministry for over 30 years, and I can still remember when I first sensed that call from God. It was a call to change the world through a life-giving message of hope – that *'God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever would believe (and trust) in Him, would not perish, but would have eternal life.'* I was impassioned about that message! I was compelled to share it! It's what got me up in the morning to go to the office!

But I know as time went by, it was easy to fall into a rut and run on auto-pilot, getting the job done, but more out of routine and duty, rather than out of my passion.

- I began to see problems more as challenges and fights to conquer, than opportunities to demonstrate God's love.

- I saw needs that used to set me on mission, become perceived as interruptions to my agenda.

- I began to see people as a bother, instead of ones whom God loves and sent His Son to die for.

What I am saying is, there have been times through my 30 years of ministry, when I've had to ask myself the hard question – *'Why am I here?'* Where is the compelling passion that brought me here in the first place?

In Revelation 2, Jesus' message to the Church in Ephesus was – I know your deeds, and all the good things you have done, but *'I have this thing against you, you have left your first love.'* You've lost that driving passion.

I found, that when I genuinely and sincerely evaluated that question, and made the necessary radical adjustments to my life, that my passion was rekindled. My priorities were realigned, and my ministry was invigorated ... because I began, again, to function from an impassioned heart.

You may be here this morning at the opening of this Second Regular Session of the Oklahoma Legislature, and you find you've been operating on auto-pilot, that you've lost your passion for being here. Your answer to that question will have a lot to do with what you accomplish here, even today.

God has placed you in this position of leadership, at this strategic time in history, to make a difference in your world. Use the passion that brought you here (and that God gave you) to honor Him.

Thank you for the leadership you offer to this great state of Oklahoma. God's richest blessing on you today, and always. Thank you."
