Second Regular Session of the Fifty-first Legislature

of the State of Oklahoma

Thirty-seventh Legislative Day, Tuesday, April 8, 2008

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Blackwell.

The roll was called with 101 Members present.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Dr. Andy Bowman, Keys Baptist Church, Park Hill.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

JOINT SESSION

Lieutenant Governor Askins recognized Representative Rex Duncan. Lieutenant Colonel Duncan, a Member of the Oklahoma Army National Guard, addressed the Joint Session and introduced Adjutant General Major General Harry M. Wyatt, III.

Major General Wyatt addressed the Joint Session and conducted the program commemorating the 45th Infantry Division Appreciation Day.

Major General Wyatt introduced The Honorable Brad Henry, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, who addressed the Joint Session.

Norman Lamb, Secretary of Veterans Affairs, read a formal Proclamation from Governor Henry recognizing 45th Appreciation Day and presented the Proclamation to Major General Wyatt.

Upon motion of Representative Piatt, the Joint Session was ordered dissolved at 10:20 a.m.
