## Second Regular Session of the Fifty-first Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

**Forty-sixth Legislative Day, Wednesday, April 23, 2008**

Section 36. A. There is hereby established a Tax Identification Division within the Oklahoma Tax Commission, which shall be charged with the execution of all laws which shall hereafter be passed in relation to voluntary tax identification programs within the state. The Tax Identification Division shall be responsible for the creation and issuance of voluntary tax identification cards to persons who are either residing or employed in this state and who have or are seeking United States citizenship or legal residency or employment status or the attorney of such a person.

B. A fee of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) shall be charged to every person that applies for the tax identification card. Any person who applies for the tax identification card shall be required to provide personal information, as determined by the Division, and shall submit to computerized finger imaging. The tax identification card shall be valid for one (1) year, but may be renewed annually. The annual renewal fee shall be One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Each tax identification card issued to an applicant shall have a corresponding identification number.

C. All records and information obtained pursuant to the voluntary tax identification card program shall be confidential and privileged. Neither the Tax Identification Division nor any employee engaged in the administration of the tax identification program shall disclose any information obtained from the records or files of the Tax Identification Division.

D. Any person who has been issued a tax identification card and has paid the fees required by this section shall not be subject to any law of this state that requires other identification documentation based solely on the fact that the person is a foreign national. This subsection shall not exempt a person from any requirement to obtain documentation that has some purpose other than identification, such as a driver license or a professional license required by the laws of this state.

E. The Tax Identification Division shall be responsible for such other duties as prescribed by law.

F. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall promulgate rules to implement this section.

The person would still need to have a driver license to drive. The person would still need to have required professional licensing.
