Second Regular Session of the Fifty-first Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Forty-seventh Legislative Day, Thursday, April 24, 2008

The House was called to order by Representative Armes.

The roll was called with 97 Members present.

“SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2006, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 350, O.S.L. 2007 (62 O.S. Supp. 2007, Section 47), is amended to read as follows:

Section 47. A. There is hereby created a trust fund for Economic Development Generating Excellence to be known as the “EDGE Fund”. The trust fund principal shall consist of all funds appropriated, transferred, donated or otherwise directed to the fund by law.

B. There is hereby created the Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund. The Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall:

1. Manage the assets of the EDGE Fund;
2. Invest monies in the manner in which a prudent person would invest it and in accordance with laws applicable to the investment of monies in state retirement funds;
3. Certify the amount of funds available for expenditure each year from the EDGE Fund. The amount of funds available for expenditure shall be limited to not more than five percent (5%) of the assets of the EDGE Fund. Any amount certified for expenditure and not expended in a given fiscal year shall remain in the EDGE Fund and may be carried over and expended in future fiscal years;

4. Retain qualified investment managers to provide for the investment of the monies of the EDGE Fund. The investment managers shall be chosen by a solicitation of proposals on a competitive basis pursuant to standards set by the Board of Investors. The investment managers shall manage those monies of the EDGE Fund allocated to the investment managers in compliance with the overall investment guidelines set by the Board of Investors. The monies of the EDGE Fund allocated to the investment managers shall be managed by the investment managers in accordance with the investment guidelines and other directions of the Board of Investors. The investment managers may sell investments and realize losses if such action is considered advantageous to longer-term return maximization. Because of the total return objective, no distinction shall be made for management and performance evaluation purposes between realized and unrealized capital gains and losses. The Board of Investors may have the State Treasurer manage those monies not specifically allocated to the investment managers;

5. Select a custodial bank to settle transactions involving the investment of funds in the EDGE Fund and to hold custody of the securities in the EDGE Fund portfolio. The custodian shall be a bank or trust company offering pension fund master trustee and master custodial services. The custodian shall be chosen by a solicitation of proposals on a competitive basis pursuant to standards set by the Board of Investors. The Board of Investors may also select professional investment consultants, auditors, and actuaries to assist the Board of Investors in carrying out its fiduciary responsibilities. All these professionals shall be selected by a solicitation of proposals on a competitive basis pursuant to standards set by the Board of Investors; and

6. Choose the professional custodians and managers of the assets of the EDGE Fund, shall establish investment and fund management guidelines, and shall adopt an investment policy. The selection and engagement of investment managers, investment consultants, auditors, and actuaries, and a custodian bank shall be exempt from the provisions of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act.

C. The Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall be composed of five (5) members as follows:

1. The State Treasurer, or a designee, who shall serve as chair;
2. An appointee of the Governor;
3. An appointee of the State Auditor and Inspector;
4. An appointee of the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
5. An appointee of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

Each appointed member of the Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall have demonstrated experience in public or private investment fund management.

D. The initially appointed members shall serve staggered terms as follows:

1. The term of the appointee of the Governor shall expire on June 30, 2007;
2. The term of the appointee of the State Auditor and Inspector shall expire on June 30, 2008;
3. The term of the appointee of the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall end on June 30, 2009; and
4. The term of the appointee of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall expire on June 30, 2010.

Thereafter, successors shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years. An appointee may be removed for cause.

E. The members of the Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall discharge their duties as trustees of the EDGE Fund:

1. With the care, skill, prudence, and diligence, under the circumstances then prevailing, that a prudent person acting in a like capacity and familiar with such matters would use in the conduct of an enterprise of a like character and with like aims;
2. By diversifying the investments in the trust fund so as to minimize the risk of large losses, unless, under the circumstances, it is clearly prudent not to do so; and
3. In accordance with the laws, documents, and instruments governing the trust fund.

F. Members of the Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall receive no salary for serving on the Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund. All members shall receive necessary travel expenses for the performance of their duties from the Office of the Governor in accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

G. The Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall annually elect a vice-chair, who shall preside over meetings in the absence of the chair, and any other officers, provided that no member shall be elected vice-chair for more than two (2) consecutive years. The Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall meet at least quarterly. A majority of the members of the Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall constitute a quorum to transact business, but no vacancy shall impair the right of the remaining members to exercise all of the powers of the Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund.

H. The Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, the Oklahoma Open Records Act and the Administrative Procedures Act.

I. Staffing for the Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall be provided by the Office of the State Treasurer. The cost of up to two full-time-equivalent employees for the Office of the State Treasurer may be considered an administrative expense of the EDGE

Fund; provided, such cost shall be determined by the EDGE Fund Policy Board, created pursuant to Section 52 of this title.

J. The Board of Investors of the EDGE Fund shall submit a report of the EDGE Fund's investments and asset value annually to the Governor and the State Treasurer.”,

All homesteads in this state shall be assessed for taxation the same as other real property therein, except that each homestead, as defined by Section 2801 et seq. of this title, shall be exempted from all forms of ad valorem taxation to the extent of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation.

B. Beginning January 1, 2010, and each January 1 thereafter, the county assessor shall determine whether there was an increase in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) as published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics for the year preceding the January 1 date. If there has been an increase in the CPI-U, the amount of the homestead exemption subscribed by subsection A of this section shall be increased by a percentage equal to the percentage increase in the CPI-U. The homestead exemption amount prescribed by subsection A of this section shall not be less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and shall not be modified for any year if the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers is a negative number.”

Should the total amount of non-state-appropriated funds not be raised or secured within ~~two~~ (2) five (5) years after the effective date of this act, the site referred to in this section shall no longer be reserved for the Plaza.

B. The Committee shall consist of seven (7) members as follows:

1. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate, or a designee;
2. The Speaker of the House of Representatives, or a designee;
3. The Governor, or a designee;
4. The Lieutenant Governor, or a designee;
5. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Historical Society, or a designee;
6. The Director of the Department of Central Services, or a designee; and
7. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Arts Council, or a designee.

C. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall annually appoint a chair and a vice-chair, respectively, from among the membership. The Committee may elect other officers as deemed necessary. Meetings

of the Committee shall be subject to the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

D. Members of the Committee shall receive no compensation for their service on the Committee, but may receive travel reimbursement as follows:

1. Legislative members of the Committee may be reimbursed for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

2. Nonlegislative state agency members of the Committee may be reimbursed by their agencies pursuant to the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act; and

3. Other members of the Committee may be reimbursed by the Oklahoma Historical Society pursuant to the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

E. Staffing for the Committee shall be provided by the staffs of the:

1. Oklahoma Historical Society;

2. Oklahoma State Senate; and

3. Oklahoma House of Representatives.

F. The duties of the Committee shall be to:

1. Develop criteria for and solicit public comment and input on the development and design of the Plaza;

2. Develop and implement criteria for a design competition which shall include, but not be limited to, solicitation of designs from appropriate persons or entities, and incorporation of any work that may already have been initiated on the design of the Plaza. The Committee shall select three designs as finalists from among the designs submitted through the competition and shall present the selected designs to the public for comment and input. The Committee shall give due consideration to the comments received from the public in choosing the design that, in the opinion of a majority of the Committee members, is most appropriate to commemorate the unique history and contributions of African Americans in Oklahoma;

3. From the three finalists, select the design winner and an alternate whose designs shall be forwarded to the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Historical Society; and

4. Provide oversight and advice to the Oklahoma Historical Society during the design and construction of the Plaza.

G. The Director of the Department of Central Services shall be responsible for awarding all contracts related to the construction of the Plaza. The Director, in consultation with the Committee, may elect to use the alternate design or recommend the reopening of the award process if the winning design construction exceeds the anticipated budget for the Plaza.

H. Upon completion of the Plaza, the Department of Central Services shall be responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the Plaza.”,

C. The board of county commissioners may also regulate and provide for taxing the owners and harborers of dogs, and authorize the humane killing or disposal of dogs, found at large, contrary to any ordinance regulating the same.

D. Any person, firm or corporation who violates any rule or regulation made by such board of county commissioners under the authority of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished as provided by the laws of this state in any court of competent jurisdiction, provided that in the case of continuing offenses, each day on which the offense occurs shall constitute a separate offense.”,
