No provider of individual or group health insurance policies, individual or group service or indemnity type contracts, health maintenance organization plans, or the Oklahoma State and Education Employees Group Insurance Board, which provides

coverage in this state, shall include coverage for erectile disorders unless coverage is also provided for autism spectrum disorders; provided, the provisions of this section shall not apply if the insured person has had a radical retropubic prostatectomy.”

REMARKS

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative McCullough, the remarks of Reverend Pryor were printed in full as follows:

“Let’s go ahead and say a prayer now, shall we.

Father we do pray for Representative Christian and his wife. We pray your blessings be on him. We pray for any others that may have been involved in the accident, and that you would right now show yourself the strong and the mighty God by taking care of them. Thank you, and it’s in your name we pray Jesus. Amen.

There was a man one time who was facing a giant crisis in his marriage. Now, he and his wife had been married about 25 years and they decided to go ahead and try counseling, actually she talked him into it as is usually the case in my business. They went to the counselor only to walk in and find the counselor to be a very young man, barely out of college himself. They sat through hours and hours of counseling. You heard them bicker back and forth, and back and forth. The counselor was frustrated and decided to take extreme measures so he looked at the husband and said, ‘Sir, this is what your wife needs twice a week.’ and he goes over and picks her up off of the couch and he lays a deep passionate kiss on her. At which point the man looks up and says, ‘If that’s all it is then she’ll be here twice a week.’

Well, we live in a great state but as you well know there are some giant problems facing us. We need some men and women who are willing to be giant slayers and tackle those problems hopefully with a little bit more tact than the counselor had. I want you to know today that according to our president our economy is going in the tank. According to my office I see families every week that are facing crisis. And so I want to do a simple bible lesson this morning over a giant slayer. His name was David. You know the story well. You know about him picking up those 5 smooth stones going out and facing this giant of a man 9 feet, 6 inches tall, whose spear alone weighed over 100 pounds which he would throw the length of a football field. But David showed up and slew the giant and eventually he was installed as the next king. But really what I want to talk to you about is, let me ask you a question; ‘How many giant slayers did Saul have in his army?’ King Saul was the king at the time when David faced Goliath. Let me help you...he had none, not one. But the follow up question is this, ‘How many giant slayers did David have in his army?’ They were coming out of the woodwork. As a matter of fact there is a passage in the bible. Let me read it to you, it goes like this:

'Once again the Philistines were at war with Israel. And when David and his men were in the thick of battle, David became weak and exhausted. Ishbi-benob was a descendant of the giants; his bronze spearhead weighed more than seven pounds, he was armed with a new sword. He had cornered David and was about to kill him. But Abishai son of Zeruiah came to David's rescue and killed the Philistine. Then David's men declared, 'You are not going out to battle with us again! Why risk snuffing out the light of Israel?' After this, there was another battle against the Philistines at Gob. As they fought, Sibbecai from Hushah killed Saph, another descendant of the giants. During another battle at Gob, Elhanan son of Jair from Bethlehem killed the brother of Goliath of Gath. The handle of his spear was as thick as a weaver's beam! In another battle with the Philistines at Gath, they encountered a huge man with six fingers on each hand and six toes on each foot, twenty-four in all, who was also a descendant of the giants. But when he defied and taunted Israel, he was killed by Jonathan, the son of David's brother Shimea. These four Philistines were descendants of the giants of Gath, but David and his warriors killed them.'

Now maybe you are here thinking, 'So what?' Do you realize that David's armies had giant killers, cropping up all over the place, because David placed his faith in a Holy God? And he believed that his God was greater than anything he would ever face. See, the truth is you can't lead people where you are not willing to go yourself. You reproduce who you are. In the state of Oklahoma we have some giants. I see it in families that are failing and an economy that is in trouble. But in this room before me I have met some men and women who not only have it within to be giant slayers, but who can raise up a generation of men and women who are giant slayers themselves. Our state will reflect leadership. Many times we think that the state legislature is a reflection of our state. That is partially true. But I want you to know that it is completely true that what kind of leader you are will determine what kind of state we are. I've met many of you this week and I believe we have some people here that have the makings of raising up around them some people who can handle the giants that face us. And I want you to know at First Baptist Church of Sapulpa we are praying for you by name; for you, for your families and most of all for your success. Because whenever you win, we win.

Let me pray for us a prayer that at our place we pray all the time. Would you please join me now in standing?

Father I pray, that we would have leaders like Moses who are determined to obey no matter what. That Father you might give us politicians like Joseph, who walked with God and sought His will for all of their policies. I pray that you would give us in this land preachers like Peter, who have the courage to look people in the eye and say 'Repent or perish'; and announce personal as well as national sins. I pray for our state God that you would give us mothers like Hannah, who would pray for their children and give them to God rather than become delinquent mothers of delinquent children. Father I pray that we would have children like Samuel, who would talk to God in the hours of the night and honor his parents in the hours of the day. Father give us physicians like Luke, who would not only care for physical needs and treat human life both in and out of the womb as something sacred, but would also introduce their patients to the great physician the Lord Jesus Christ. Father we pray that as a state we would have a God like Israel's. Not the man upstairs but a thrice holy God who blesses holiness and curses sinfulness. And most of all may we have a Savior like Jesus, who can save anyone, at anytime, in any place, including an entire world if they would just turn to him. It's only when we turn to you God, to you Jesus Christ, that we can look in the mirror and like what we see, and begin to enjoy the prosperity that you have intended for us in the great state of Oklahoma. Once again Father,

we pray for your blessing. We pray once again for Mike Christian and his wife and may you Jesus above all be honored in this place today. It's in your name that we pray. Amen.”

Representative Jones moved that when the clerk's desk is clear, the House stand adjourned to reconvene at 1:30 p.m., Monday, March 2, 2009, which was the order.
