- c. any fireworks activity is conducted over a nonflammable surface, is at least ten (10) feet from flammable vegetation, wind speeds are less than twenty (20) miles per hour, and a fire watch, other than the fireworks user, is posted at the fireworks site with pressurized water or a fire extinguisher.

8. Any person operating a retail location where fireworks are sold directly to the consumer shall be required to purchase a retail fireworks license. The retail license fee shall be Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) annually and may be purchased from any licensed wholesaler, manufacturer, or distributor. All license fees shall be collected by the State Fire Marshal Commission and shall be paid to the State Treasurer to the credit of the State Fire Marshal Revolving Fund. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of each license fee collected shall be made available for public safety and education messages in areas under a burn ban from June 15 through July 6 and from December 1 to January 2 each year to educate the public on the safe usage of fireworks. Any unused fees from each calendar year shall remain in the State Fire Marshal Revolving Fund to be used for any lawful purpose.

9. Serially numbered licenses shall be made available at any time to the licensed wholesalers, manufacturers, or distributors in books of twenty licenses to a book. Retail licenses which are unsold may be exchanged for new licenses.
