Representative Brown raised a point of order inquiring whether the floor substitute was in order for consideration by the House because the amendment contained two different titles of law.

The Presiding Officer stated that the Chair does not rule on constitutionality and therefore ruled the point not well taken.

Representative Brown asked a ruling of the Presiding Officer whether the floor substitute was germane to **HB 2602**.

The Presiding Officer stated that the floor substitute contained subject matter that is common and closely akin to **HB 2602**. Because both the measure and the amendment deal with reserve law enforcement officers, the Presiding Officer ruled that the amendment was more likely than not germane to the measure, and therefore the point not well taken.
