Representative Morgan raised a point of inquiry as to whether it was permissible in a situation like this when a member had voted differently than they intended to rescind the vote on the measure.

The Presiding Officer stated that there were two approaches to this situation. A member may serve notice to reconsider the measure whereby it passed or failed, and once that approach has been exhausted they may move to rescind the vote.

Representative Wright (John) raised a point of inquiry as to whether a unanimous consent request to rescind the vote on **HB 2747** was presently in order.

The Presiding Officer stated that it was not in order pursuant to Mason's Manual, Section 841, paragraph four (4).

Representative Brown raised a point of order that since no one had served notice to reconsider the vote and the House had taken up consideration of the emergency clause, the motion to rescind would now be in order.

The Presiding Officer declared the point not well taken.
