MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR

Advising of his veto of **HB 3284** on May 22, 2010. The veto message reads as follows:

To the Honorable Speaker of the House
and Members of the House of Representatives
First Regular Session, Fifty-second Oklahoma Legislature

Enrolled House Bill No. **3284**

By: Peterson, et al of the House and Jolley, et al of the Senate

This is to advise you that on this date, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 11 and 12 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution to approve or object to legislation presented to me, I have VETOED House Bill **3284**. While I support reasonable restrictions on abortion, this legislation has numerous flaws. As with previous abortion bills I have vetoed, **HB 3284** lacks an essential exemption for rape and incest victims. By forcing them to submit to a personally invasive questionnaire and posting the answers on a state website, this legislation will only increase the trauma of an already traumatic event. Victims of such horrific acts should be treated with dignity and respect in such situations, as should all people. Requiring patients to publicly reveal highly intimate and personal details of their lives to obtain a medical procedure protected by this nation's highest court constitutes an unconstitutional invasion of privacy and barrier to legal medical treatment. If it were to become law, **HB 3284** would be challenged in court and result in an expensive and potentially futile legal battle for the state. Because of these many flaws, this legislation is not in the best interest of the state of Oklahoma.

Pursuant to the motion offered by Representative Lamons to include a verbatim record of debate, the debate offered was ordered printed in full as follows:

REPRESENTATIVE DUNCAN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members, I want it to be transparent and clear and easily understandable, this is a tax increase. You can call it a fee increase, you can call it whatever you want. There is no shortage in the State of Oklahoma of tax increase, fee increase pimps out there and it doesn't matter how much money you match to it, it's still a tax and fee increase. Just deal with it.

I yield the balance of my time to Representative Osborn.

PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you, Representative Duncan. Representative Holland, you are now recognized for two minutes eight seconds for debate in opposition to the passage of the emergency.

REPRESENTATIVE HOLLAND: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members, I know you got a handout from the Hospital Association and I'm not going to yell at you today. In the interest of full disclosure, my wife is a nurse. My wife works for a hospital. She's in administration. There you go. And for the record, I'm going to be voting against this again for the reasons that I said. On the handout that we received, I agree with almost every single thing on there except for the very end; and what it says is if we do not pass House Bill 2437 then all of these negative things occurs. That goes with the assumption that this is the only solution out there, and if that's the case, I want to commend the 52nd Legislature,

because guess what we've done? We passed a 6.6 billion dollar budget and there is not any waste, there is not anything else that needs to be cut, there is not any tax credits that need to be rolled back or anything. Every dollar is accounted for. Congratulations. Congratulations. We can't find any more money. Well, I say that that's not true. There's plenty of money out there. Now, I apologize for not bringing you a letter. I could have stuck a letter on your desk had I had time to go into your district. I know that what's going to be brought up, is that you have a hospital in your district or whatever, if you have a hospital in your district. Let me tell you what I have in my district. I have a lot of taxpayers. And one of the pledges I made when I came up here is I'm not going to vote to increase taxes. That would be the absolute last resort and we're not at the absolute last resort yet. It's not necessary to do this. We have other options on the table and we need to pursue those things. And let me tell you in this moment, what I've already found. In this moment, in this room, I can probably justify in my mind voting for this because there is a lot of comfort out here on the floor. Come June and July when I'm going door to door I couldn't defend this for five seconds because people will see it for what it is. It is a tax increase on the people in your district that are going to have to pay for this, and so I would urge you to please vote this down. There are other things that we can do. Don't let what they are going to give it, to be the thing that makes you decide to do what --

PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you, Representative Holland.

Representative Osborn, you're now recognized for one minute and thirty five seconds for debate in opposition to passage of the emergency.

REPRESENTATIVE OSBORN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. First of all, I'd like to say that a vote against this is not a vote against the Healthcare Authority. That's just the way it was packaged when it was sold to us. This is a tax increase. There is nothing to say it is anything but a tax increase and it's a guilt trip to say that this is money that will go from OHCA to make us feel bad if we don't vote. Because those dollars could have been given to OHCA if we had manned up like we are supposed to when we come up here and made the tough vote and took more money out of every other budget. Because if we had wanted to just do the easy thing, we could have sent our grandmothers up here. But they sent us up here to do the tough thing. And the tough thing is you cut more out of those other budgets and don't tell us that this is for the OHCA.

Number two, this is a tax increase. Everybody in this state that we talked to about please buy insurance, do the right thing. Hardworking, self-employed Oklahomans that go out and buy a tax -- a health insurance policy, this is a tax on them because they did not request this and they get no benefit from this. So every dollar that the health insurance company has to pay to the Healthcare Authority will be passed back to the hardworking Oklahoman taxpayers that pay for their own health insurance policy. And that's wrong. So what we're doing is saying it's okay to take from the insured, we are re-distributing wealth. We are doing exactly what we talk about them doing in Washington, and this is nothing but an Oklahoma socialist move. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you, Representative Osborn. Representative Reynolds, you're now recognized for one minute, four seconds for debate in opposition to passage of the emergency.

REPRESENTATIVE REYNOLDS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members, how ironic that we want everybody's remarks recorded and we move the previous question so nobody will have any remarks. That's a stunning turn of events, isn't it?

But what we are going to do is deprive the taxpayers of the initiative petition process on the first tax increase in state history. That's what the emergency clause does. We're not

voting on the bill. The bill has already passed. The taxpayers are already going to judge you based on whether or not you based it on the tax increase. Now they will be judging you on, based on whether or not you have refused to allow the initiative petition process so that they can plainly tell that we don't want this tax increase. Legislators that have voted for it, you're going to get the message. You'll get it at the ballot booth but unfortunately if the emergency clause passes you won't get it sooner than that. I encourage you to vote against the emergency clause. I yield the balance of my time to Representative Sullivan.

PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you, Representative Reynolds. Representative Richardson, you're now recognized for one minute and fifteen seconds for debate in favor of passage of the emergency.

REPRESENTATIVE RICHARDSON: Members, I know that several of us are rural legislators and chances are you represent some rural hospitals. I have two in my district. They are both two doctor hospitals that barely keep the population [inaudible]. These are largely Medicare and Medicaid. In fact, 80 percent of the patients that [inaudible].

PRESIDING OFFICER: Representative Richardson, would you try that again.

REPRESENTATIVE RICHARDSON: Okay, is that working now?

PRESIDING OFFICER: Working now.

REPRESENTATIVE RICHARDSON: Eighty-five percent of the patients that are utilizing these hospitals are Medicare/Medicaid and they absolutely cannot -- cannot fail. They represent -- also out of these hospitals they run ambulance services that serve over 10,000 people in the county. If they lose these hospitals, you're looking at 30 miles to the closest hospital. And this is not unique, I don't think, for any part -- any of these rural hospitals in Oklahoma that they're population based because of the elderly population in our rural areas is probably somewhere in the neighborhood of 75-plus percent of Medicare/Medicaid patients. They need to be -- we need to see that they -- that this system maintains its viability

PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you, Representative Richardson.

Representative Sullivan, you are now recognized for two minutes and eleven seconds for closing debate in opposition to the passage of the emergency.

REPRESENTATIVE SULLIVAN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members, I find it ironic, the person making the motion to have these comments recorded is not saying a word when it comes to the bill.

I, personally, am used to having everything that I say that is important on the record, so it certainly doesn't make any difference to me.

What is important to know, and that the people of the State of Oklahoma need to know, is that passage of this emergency clause on this revenue-raising bill will provide yet another opportunity for a Constitutional challenge that I think is hands down, ready and packaged and ready to go.

Because Article 5, Section 33, in the Oklahoma Constitution states that no revenue bill shall be passed during the five last days of the session. If this wasn't a revenue-raising bill, then why are they saying if the emergency doesn't pass, we'll lose money? If that's not the definition of a revenue-raising bill, I don't know what it is. And it also states that if we're going to do this -- not withstanding the last five days of the session, it has to be done by three-fourths vote. This bill passed by 57 votes. That's not three-fourths. And the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma says that if you're going to do it by three-fourths vote, you cannot have an emergency clause.

You know why? That's to allow the other parts of the Constitution that says that any taxpayer in the state of Oklahoma can challenge such a bill and file an initiative petition if

they wanted; they can file an action in the Courts in the State of Oklahoma. Your actions by making this go into effect at the signing of the Governor, offends the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. That doesn't have anything to do with the merits of the bill. That's what the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma says.

Now, if you want to talk about the merits of the bill, this is something that will raise premiums, this is something that we've said that we stand against. It will not solve the problem of uninsured in the State of Oklahoma. If we were going to do something like this, we need to do it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you, Representative Sullivan.

Representative Cox, you're now recognized for six minutes, 15 seconds in closing debate in favor of passage of the emergency.

REPRESENTATIVE COX: Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

First of all, I've heard it said around the Chamber today that this really isn't part of the budget agreement. It is very much a part of the budget agreement. It's not appropriated dollars, but it's very much a part of the budget agreement. Failure of this emergency leaves a 78 million dollar hole in the budget.

But you know, more importantly, I don't think we have ever debated an emergency clause out here in the six years that I've been here, to this extent. But in the six years I've been here, I don't think we've ever had an emergency clause where the failure of it resulted in a 68 million dollar hickey to the healthcare of Oklahomans.

Of that, 58-and-a-half million dollars is federal money that we'll leave on the table.

But who does this 78 million dollars that we're talking about, with just the emergency clause, who does that affect? It affects 692,800 low income people in Oklahoma that depend on this coverage for their medical care. I dare say that every one of you in this Chamber has a friend, and probably every one of you in this Chamber has a relative that depends on that system for their medical care. They depend on that system to keep them out of medical bankruptcy and, yes, it is sad to say that medical expenses are about the number one cause of bankruptcy in the State of Oklahoma.

But who does this money really affect? If you have a friend that works in a hospital or someone that is in the hospital, it affects their job, it affects the care that they receive. If you have a friend or relative that's in a nursing home or know someone who works in the nursing home, this money affects the care they receive, it affects those people's job security.

If you know someone who sells crutches, walkers, bedside commodes, colostomy supplies, prosthesis for women who have had mastectomies, or if you know someone who works for a company that does that, this bill affects those patients and the people whose work is these jobs.

If you have a friend or relative, or know someone that works for a doctor, this bill affects their job security, and that doctor's patient's access to medical care.

Who does this bill affect? We're not talking about 78 million dollars that this emergency clause will enable us to get, again 58 million of it federal money, that's going to go over there and sit in a fund for the Healthcare Authority to play with and count every day. That money is going to be paid out to the OU Health Sciences Center. That money is going to be paid out to the Oklahoma State University Health Sciences Center. That 78 million dollars is going to be paid out to the Department of Mental Health. So if you think that Oklahoma deserves better mental healthcare for their citizens, you should be for this bill. Because that money trickles down to the community health clinic in your district. This money is paid out to our State Health Department. So if you believe that your county should have a health department nurse to administer vaccines, if you believe that

Oklahomans should have access to cancer, breast and cervical screening tests, then you should vote for this emergency measure.

This 78 million dollars, part of it will be paid out to the J.D. McCarty Center for children with developmental disabilities. If you have never been down there and seen some of those kids that will benefit from this money, and seen what they do for these kids, I encourage you to do so the second week of June, when you've got some free time.

This money, part of it will be paid out to the homes in your district that house the mentally handicapped.

You know, they did send us up here to do a tough job. Oklahomans want leaders, but they want compassionate leaders. And I dare say when you knock on those doors, and you explain your vote based on the compassion that you have for Oklahomans and their friends and relatives and neighbors in their district and in your district, that they are going to look you in the eye and they are going to say, thank you Representative, we appreciate your compassion. Think about the compassion for all of those people that I mentioned, and join with me in approving the emergency measure on this bill to garner 78 million dollars, 58 and-a-half million of which will go to the healthcare of 692,800 Oklahomans and all of the people associated with it.

Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: Representative Cox, will you yield to questions?

REPRESENTATIVE COX: I yield the rest of my time to the Chair, thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you. Members, you've heard the debate.

Representative Randy McDaniel, for what purpose?

REPRESENTATIVE MCDANIEL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I have a point of information. In his debate it was continually referred to 78 million dollars, that this would cut us, without passing it. The best information I've been able to receive --

PRESIDING OFFICER: Representative McDaniel, your question is out of order.

REPRESENTATIVE MCDANIEL: My question is, do we have a fiscal analysis on whether we will lose the federal match --

PRESIDING OFFICER: Members of the House will come to order.

Representative McDaniel, would you please restate your question.

REPRESENTATIVE MCDANIEL: Mr. Speaker, I'm not trying to cause trouble here, I'm just trying to get a fiscal analysis. My understanding is the federal match very well may be still intact whether we pass this emergency bill or not. That makes a huge impact on the dollars we're talking about. I'd like to hear an official answer on whether we have a fiscal analysis and what that number would actually be.

PRESIDING OFFICER: Representative McDaniel, at this point the Chair will not entertain your question. And we've moved past the debate and it would be up to the individual Member to obtain that information prior to this point in the process.

Representative Brown, state your point.

REPRESENTATIVE BROWN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, it is incumbent upon us to pass a balanced budget. Would you say then, that by not passing this, that we would go into revenue failure?
