Eighth Legislative Day, Thursday, February 11, 2010

The House was called to order by Speaker Bengé.

The roll was called with 99 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Nations, Williams.—2.

The Speaker declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Mark McIntosh, Evangelistic Center, Shawnee.
Pastor McIntosh was sponsored by Representative Jett.

Upon motion of Representative Osborn, Pastor McIntosh was confirmed as House Chaplain for this legislative day.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

ENGROSSED AND ENROLLED MEASURES

HBs 2292, 2350, 2351, 2352, 2353, 2354, 2355, 2356, 2357, 2365, 2366 and 2837 were reported correctly engrossed, properly signed, in open session, and ordered transmitted to the Honorable Senate.

GENERAL ORDER

HB 2956 by Wright (Harold) et al of the House and Jolley of the Senate was read and considered.

Upon request of Representative Jones, **HB 2956** was laid over.

MOTION

Representative Jones moved that the Honorable Senate be notified by message that the House of Representatives is organized and ready to convene in Joint Session, which was the order.

JOINT SESSION

The Second Joint Session of the Second Regular Session of the Fifty-second Legislature assembled in the House Chamber on Thursday, February 11, 2010, and was called to order by Lieutenant Governor Jari Askins.

Lieutenant Governor Askins declared quorums of the Senate and House present and the Joint Session duly assembled.

President Askins recognized Richard Devine, Sgt. at Arms who led the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Askins recognized Speaker Bengé who addressed the Joint Session.

President Askins recognized President Pro Tempore Coffee who addressed the Joint Session.

Lieutenant Governor Askins addressed the Joint Session.

President Askins recognized Oklahoma Veterans Council Chairman Pete Peterson who conducted the Veterans Awareness Day Ceremony.

Chairman Peterson recognized Senator Reynolds, Chair of the Senate Veterans and Military Affairs Committee who introduced the Senate Veterans committee members.

Chairman Peterson recognized Representative Banz, Chair of the House Veterans and Military Affairs Committee who introduced the House Veterans committee members.

Chairman Peterson addressed the Joint Session.

President Askins recognized Chaplain Jerry Riley, Oklahoma Veterans Council, who offered the closing benediction.

Upon motion of Representative Jones, the Joint Session was ordered dissolved at 10:20 a.m.
