MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of engrossed **SBs 45, 102, 270, 289, 379, 417** and **595**.

The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 45 – By Garrison, Allen, Johnson (Constance) and Barrington of the Senate and Faught, Pittman and Shumate of the House.

An Act relating to memorial bridge designations; designating the Bass Reeves Memorial Bridge; requiring certain markers; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 102 – By Aldridge of the Senate and Schwartz of the House.

[Oklahoma Energy Independence Act - loan requirements - clarifying terms - modifying provisions - effective date]

SB 270 – By Burrage and Garrison of the Senate and Martin (Scott) of the House.

An Act relating to Oklahoma Accountancy Act; amending 59 O.S. 2001, Sections 15.12A, as last amended by Section 6, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2010, 15.15A, as last amended by Section 12, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2010, and 15.30, as amended by Section 25, Chapter 125, O.S.L. 2004 (59 O.S. Supp. 2010, Sections 15.12A, 15.15A and 15.30), which relate to licensee's jurisdiction, firm permits and peer reviews; modifying types of services and standards of practice for certain permit; clarifying proof of firm ownership; requiring firm compliance with certain rules under permit; declaring nonlicensed firm owners active participants of the firm; requiring certain persons to meet certain competency requirements for certain services and reports; authorizing peer reviews for certain services upon issuance or renewal of permits; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 289 – By David of the Senate and Kirby of the House.

[examinations by professionals - Insurance Commissioner - eliminating requirement that certain cost be paid - emergency]

SB 379 – By Simpson of the Senate and Ownbey of the House.

An Act relating to homemade amusement rides; defining terms; prohibiting homemade amusement rides in public; setting penalties; providing enhanced penalty under certain circumstance; authorizing operation of certain ride with permit and inspection; requiring posting of permit and certificate of inspection; directing the Department of Labor to promulgate rules and forms; construing authority of municipality to regulate homemade amusement rides; directing certain compliance; authorizing Department of Labor to adopt certain standards; providing for development of other standards; setting items to be evaluated; granting certain immunity to the Department of Labor; directing fees in sufficient amounts to cover administration and costs; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 417 – By Anderson and Johnson (Constance) of the Senate and Richardson of the House.

An Act relating to waste management vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Sections 11-1003 and 11-1004, which relate to stopping, standing or parking; providing exemptions for certain waste management vehicles; and providing an effective date.

SB 595 – By Brinkley of the Senate and Derby of the House.

An Act relating to highway advertising programs; directing the Secretary of Transportation to conduct study of certain alternative highway advertising programs and make report by certain date; authorizing use of staff; authorizing appointment of certain working group; providing for noncodification; and declaring an emergency.

GENERAL ORDER

HB 2140 by Steele of the House and Bingman of the Senate was read and considered.

Coauthored by Representative(s) Murphey

Representative Murphey moved to amend **HB 2140**, Page 3, Section 2, Lines 5 and 15 and Page 6, Section 4, Line 22 by replacing the words “Oklahoma Department of Libraries” with the words “The Archives Division of the Oklahoma State Library”; Page 5, Section 3, Line 9 by replacing the words “Oklahoma Department of Libraries” with the words “The Archives Division of the Office of State Finance”; by removing Section 10; and by inserting the following language and renumbering subsequent sections:

“SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 67 O.S. 2001, Section 305, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 24, O.S.L. 2007 (67 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 305) is amended to read as follows:

Section 305. There is hereby re-created until July 1, 2013, in accordance with the Oklahoma Sunset Law, the Archives and Records Commission, hereinafter referred to as the Commission, to be composed of ~~one (1) member to be appointed by the Governor~~ the State Librarian who shall serve as Chairman, the ~~State Librarian~~ Director of the Office of State Finance or designee as ~~Vice-Chairman~~ Vice-chair and Secretary, the Lieutenant Governor, the State Auditor and Inspector and the State Treasurer as members. Any member may appoint and designate a subofficer or employee as his proxy for purposes of carrying on the duties of the Commission. The Commission shall have sole, entire and exclusive authority of the disposition for all public records and archives of state officers, departments, boards, commissions, agencies and institutions of this state. The authority herein granted shall not apply to records and archives of political subdivisions of the state; provided, however, this act shall not apply to the confidential records and files of the Oklahoma Tax Commission which are exempt from all provisions of this act.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 67 O.S. 2001, Section 306, is amended to read as follows:

Section 306. Every state officer and the heads of all departments, boards, commissions, agencies and institutions of the State of Oklahoma who have in their custody public records and archives deemed by them to be unnecessary for the transaction of the business of their offices shall consult with the ~~State Librarian~~ Director of the Office of State Finance for the purpose of determining if such records and archives are desired for deposit in the archives division of the ~~Oklahoma State Library~~ Office of State Finance. Upon certification by the ~~State Librarian~~ Director of the Office of State Finance that such records and archives are or are not desired for such purpose, then such custodian shall, in conformity with such determination, apply to the Commission for authorization to destroy or transfer such records and archives to the ~~Oklahoma State Library~~ archives division of the Office of State Finance as hereinafter provided. Upon the filing of such application the

Commission shall have authority to authorize or direct the disposition of such records and archives by any one or more of the following methods:

1. By destruction; provided that, the Commission shall not authorize destruction of records and archives less than five (5) years old except upon a showing of good cause by the agency or the Archives and Records Division of the ~~Oklahoma Department of Libraries~~ Office of State Finance and a unanimous vote of the members of the Commission, or their designees, present;

2. By transfer to the custody and control of the ~~Oklahoma State Library~~ archives division of the Office of State Finance and there retained. The State Librarian may, in his discretion, microfilm such records and archives, especially if so doing would aid in the preservation of their contents; or

3. By transfer to the ~~Oklahoma State Library~~ archives division of the Office of State Finance with authorization to the ~~State Librarian~~ Director of the Office of State Finance to microfilm said records and archives and upon the completion of this process to destroy said records and archives in accordance with the order of the Commission.

Records and archives transferred to the ~~Oklahoma State Library~~ archives division of the Office of State Finance shall never be returned to their former custody except by order of the Commission and written consent of the ~~State Librarian~~ Director of the Office of State Finance.

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 67 O.S. 2001, Section 311, is amended to read as follows:

Section 311. The Secretary of the Archives and Records Commission in person, or through a deputy authorized by him, shall have the right of access to all public records and archives of this state, except those records and archives classified as confidential by Act of the Legislature, with a view of securing their safety and preservation and determining their administrative or legal value. On behalf of the State of Oklahoma, the Office of State Finance and the Oklahoma State Library the Attorney General may replevin any public records or archives illegally removed which were formerly part of the records or files of any public office of the Territory or of the State of Oklahoma.

SECTION 4. REPEALER 67 O.S. 2001, Section 312, is hereby repealed.”,

which amendment was declared adopted.
