First Regular Session of the Fifty-third Legislature

of the State of Oklahoma

Sixteenth Legislative Day, Monday, March 7, 2011

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Hickman.

The roll was called with 101 Members present.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Scott Morie, Indian Springs Baptist Church, Broken Arrow. Pastor Morie was sponsored by Representative Ritze.

Upon motion of Representative Thomsen, Pastor Morie was confirmed as House Chaplain for this legislative day.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

ENGROSSED AND ENROLLED MEASURES

HBs 1249 and **2118** were reported correctly engrossed, properly signed, in open session, and ordered transmitted to the Honorable Senate.

HR 1009 was reported correctly enrolled, properly signed, in open session, and ordered transmitted to the Secretary of State.

MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of engrossed **SBs 95, 587, 738, 866** and **SJR 37**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 95 – By Fields of the Senate and McNeil of the House.

An Act relating to oversize vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 14-111, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 363, O.S.L. 2010 (47 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 14-111), which relates to livestock transporters; removing requirement for transporting certain livestock in vehicles displaying certain signage; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 587 – By Bingman of the Senate and Trebilcock of the House.

An Act relating to the Corporation Commission Well Plugging Fund; amending 17 O.S. 2001, Section 180.10, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 252, O.S.L. 2006 (17 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 180.10), which relates to the Corporation Commission Plugging Fund; modifying certain termination date for plugging fund; clarifying language; and amending 68 O.S. 2001, Sections 1101, 1102 and 1103, as last amended by Sections 2, 3 and 4, Chapter 252, O.S.L. 2006 (68 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 1101, 1102 and 1103), which relate to the excise tax on oil and gas; extending termination date for certain taxes; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 738 – By Schulz of the Senate and Sanders of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Liquefied Petroleum Gas Research, Marketing and Safety Commission; amending 52 O.S. 2001, Sections 420.24 and 420.25, which relate to powers and duties of the Commission and appointment of Director; authorizing the Commission to contract for services of certain employees; and declaring an emergency.

SB 866 – By Sykes and Brecheen of the Senate and Sullivan of the House.

An Act relating to compensation for future damages; defining terms; stating applicability of provisions; providing for periodic payment of certain damages; requiring court to make specific findings; stating result of entry of certain order; requiring evidence of financial responsibility for certain defendants; requiring certain order upon termination of periodic payments; providing procedures upon death of recipient of periodic payments; establishing computation for attorney fees; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SJR 37 – By Schulz of the Senate and Osborn of the House.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 2 of Article V of the Oklahoma Constitution; requiring certain percentage of signatures in each congressional district for initiative and referenda; requiring Governor to cause certain fiscal analysis to be prepared; requiring summary thereof to be on ballot; providing ballot title; and directing filing.
