Enrolled House Bill No. **1812**

This is to advise you that on this date, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 11 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution to approve or object to legislation presented to me, I have VETOED House Bill **1812**. This bill would increase the current limit on certain contracts not requiring competitive bidding from \$50,000.00 to \$100,000.00. In order to ensure continued transparency, accountability, and public confidence in the expenditure of public funds, this limit should not be increased.
