The Presiding Officer stated that the timing of when a bill goes into effect is governed by the Oklahoma Constitution and because the bill did not contain an effective date, the default effective date would be ninety (90) days after Sine Die Adjournment as prescribed by the Oklahoma Constitution. The Chair also took notice of the fact that numerous other bills had been passed without an express effective date.

Representative Morrissette raised a point of order as to whether the ruling made by the Chair was a constitutional ruling.

The Presiding Officer stated that the Chair's response to Representative Rousselot's previous point of order was informational and as in previous instances where constitutional questions were raised regarding the format of a bill, the Chair would not weigh in on such questions and it would be up to the House to decide whether to pass the bill as drafted.

Representative Morrissette appealed the ruling of the Presiding Officer receiving the required 15 seconds.

"The question is, shall the decision of the Presiding Officer be the decision of the House? All those in favor signify by voting 'Aye'; those opposed 'Nay'. The vote is now in progress."
