Announcing the passage of **SBs 178, 1001, 1041, 1055, 1060, 1127, 1156, 1179, 1222, 1229, 1239, 1264, 1321, 1409, 1483, 1506, 1511, 1525, 1530, 1533, 1616, 1623, 1634, 1638, 1642, 1643, 1665, 1667, 1694, 1696, 1714, 1760, 1761, 1771, 1780, 1792, 1793, 1796, 1797, 1816, 1830, 1866, 1868, 1877, 1879, 1889, 1908, 1913, 1919, 1951** and **SJR 52**.

The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 178 – By Crain of the Senate and Cox of the House.

An Act relating to standards of care in extreme emergencies; authorizing the State Board of Health to adopt certain rules and requirements; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1001 – By Stanislawski of the Senate and Quinn of the House.

An Act relating to forfeiture of retirement benefits; requiring forfeiture of certain benefits for members of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma upon conviction of certain crimes; specifying circumstances in which retirement benefits shall be subject to forfeiture; providing that forfeiture will cease if conviction is reversed by highest applicable appellate court; requiring notice to the System of such forfeiture; providing procedures for the System to follow upon receipt of notice of forfeiture; allowing spouse of certain member to receive certain retirement benefit; specifying that the member shall not have interest in certain spousal benefit; prohibiting spousal benefit under certain conditions; providing that spousal benefit is not applicable if certain contributions are withdrawn; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

An Act relating to public bid notices; amending 61 O.S. 2011, Section 104, which relates to bid notices; modifying certain requirement for notification to trade or construction publications; construing extent of trade or construction publication notice; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1055 – By Russell and Simpson of the Senate and Enns of the House.

[firearm possession - mandatory preclusions - guidelines for certain inquiries - codification - effective date]

SB 1060 – By Brown of the Senate and Grau of the House.

An Act relating to insurance fraud; amending 36 O.S. 2011, Section 363, which relates to notification of suspected fraud; requiring insurers to notify the Workers' Compensation and Insurance Fraud Unit of the Office of the Attorney General of suspected insurance fraud; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1127 – By Justice of the Senate and Kirby of the House.
