

# HOUSE JOURNAL

**Second Regular Session of the Fifty-third Legislature**

**of the State of Oklahoma**

**Twenty-ninth Legislative Day, Tuesday, March 27, 2012**

The House was called to order by Representative Denney.

The roll was called with 97 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Enns, Tibbs.—2.

Vacancy: District 71, District 88.—2.

Representative Denney declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Walter Mullican, Portland Avenue Baptist Church, Oklahoma City. Pastor Mullican was sponsored by Representative Kern.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

**HCR 1035** – By Coody of the House and Bass of the Senate.

A Concurrent Resolution opposing elimination of certain federal Impact Aid funding and encouraging full funding; distribution.

**GENERAL ORDER**

**SB 301** by Stanislawski of the Senate and Mulready of the House was read and considered.

Representative Inman moved to amend **SB 301** by inserting new Sections 1-4, and by renumbering subsequent sections.

Representative Blackwell moved to table the Inman amendment, which tabling motion was declared adopted upon a division of the question.

Representative Mulready moved that **SB 301** be advanced from General Order, which motion was declared adopted.
