**SB 1043** by Marlatt et al of the Senate and Martin (Scott) of the House was read and considered.

“SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-6-110 of Title 27A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

When promulgating rules or establishing guidelines for the monitoring of cyanobacteria, also known as blue-green algae, in bodies of water and for the issuance of swimming and fishing advisories related to the presence of cyanobacteria in a body of water, the Environmental Quality Board shall use an analysis of the level cyanobacteria toxin present in the water rather than or in addition to the cell density of toxic cyanobacteria present in the water as the basis for identifying hazardous conditions and issuing advisories and warnings.”,

A. If the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System has a funded ratio of at least ninety percent (90%), the Board of Trustees of the System may authorize a retirement benefit increase not to exceed two percent (2%).

B. As used in this section, “funded ratio” means the figure derived by dividing the actuarial value of the assets of the retirement system by the actuarial accrued liability of the retirement system.”
