Representative Dorman moved to postpone consideration of the emergency clause until Monday, April 8, 2013, to be considered as the first order of business following the daily invocation.

Representative Murphey moved to table the Dorman motion, which tabling motion was declared adopted upon a division of the question.

Representative Proctor then raised a point of inquiry as to whether the emergency clause could be properly considered because the measure was not eligible to be considered by the House.

The Presiding Officer stated that if a point of inquiry had been raised prior to passage of **SB 1009**, the bill would have been withdrawn from further consideration until such time as the bill could properly be placed before the House for consideration. Because no point of inquiry was raised prior to final passage of the bill, in the opinion of the Chair, the most orderly manner in which to proceed was to continue with consideration of the emergency clause.
