Thirty-fourth Legislative Day, Wednesday, April 2, 2014

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Jackson.

The roll was called with 100 Members present.

The following Member was excused: DeWitt.—1.

Speaker Pro Tempore Jackson declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Matthew P. Martin, Dewar United Pentecostal Church, Morris. Pastor Martin was sponsored by Representative Kirby.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

ENGROSSED AND ENROLLED MEASURES

HBs 2496 and **2921** were reported correctly enrolled and, after fourth reading, properly signed, in open session, and ordered transmitted to the Honorable Senate.

Lieutenant Governor Lamb addressed the Joint Session.

President Lamb recognized Oklahoma Veterans Council Chairman Pete Peterson who conducted the Veterans Awareness Day Ceremony.

Veterans Council Chairman Pete Peterson recognized Representative Hardin as Representative of the Year and Senator Simpson as Senator of the Year.
