Fifty-eighth Legislative Day, Thursday, May 15, 2014

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Jackson.

The roll was called with 97 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Cox, Henke, Watson, Williams.—4.

Speaker Pro Tempore Jackson declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Director John Talley, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Stillwater. Director Talley was sponsored by Representative Thomsen.

Upon motion of Representative Cockroft, Director Talley was confirmed as House Chaplain for this legislative week.

Representative Sherrer raised a point of order as to whether consideration of **HB 3509** was out of order pursuant to House Rule 6.8, the final action rule, due to the fact that the Governor had previously vetoed **HB 2832**, a bill containing language identical to that of **HB 3509**. The Presiding Officer ruled the point not well taken pursuant to *House Precedent* 6.8-2. (2008).

Representative Morrisette raised a point of order as to what House Rule permitted scheduling of **HB 3510** for consideration on the House Floor, to which the Presiding Officer referenced Section 7.21 of House Rules.

Representative Inman raised a point of order as to what House Rule permitted consideration of **HB 3510** after the legislative deadlines, to which the Presiding Officer referenced Section 6.2(b)(3) of House Rules.

Representative Inman raised a point of order as to whether it was proper for a bill to be scheduled for consideration on the House Floor without having first passed through the committee process, to which the Presiding Officer referenced Section 1.4(a) of House Rules stating that the measure had been referred Direct to Calendar by the Speaker.

Representative Sherrer raised a point of order as to whether a measure, introduced pursuant to Section 6.2(b)(3) of House Rules, in response to an emergency situation, would result in failure of the measure itself if the emergency was not passed by the House, to which the Presiding Officer ruled that it was up to the House itself to decide whether or not to pass the emergency on **HB 3510** and that the measure itself would not fail if the emergency failed of adoption.

Representative Sherrer raised a point of order as to whether it was in order to consider **HB 3510** unless existence of an emergency could be established, to which the Presiding Officer ruled that because the Speaker had introduced and scheduled **HB 3510**, the Chair would presume that consideration of the measure was in compliance with Section 6.2(b)(3) of House Rules and that whether the House adopted the emergency section would be up to the House itself.

Representative Inman raised a point of order as to when **HB 3510** underwent the constitutionally required First Reading and Second Reading, to which the Chair responded that **HB 3510** underwent First Reading on Monday, May 12, when the bill was filed in the Clerk's office and published in the House Journal and that Second Reading occurred on Tuesday, May 13 in open session.

Representative Perryman raised a point of order as to whether a veto by the Governor constituted final action under House Rules, to which the Chair responded in the negative. Representative Perryman appealed the ruling of the Chair receiving the required 15 seconds.
