An Act relating to revenue and taxation; enacting the Oklahoma Affordable Housing Act of 2014; defining terms; authorizing specified amount of credit to be claimed against various tax types for certain qualified projects within specified time period; setting cap on credits which may be claimed for a specified project and for all projects within certain time period; providing method for allocating credits under cap; requiring certain eligibility statement; authorizing taxpayer to assign specified interest; providing for treatment of liability for retaliatory tax; providing that credit is not refundable and may be carried

forward for specified time period; requiring certain documentation be provided for credit to be allowed; providing for recapture of credit under specified circumstances and to specified extent; providing for review of the act under specified time frame; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

Second Regular Session, Fifty-fourth Oklahoma Legislature

Enrolled House Bill No. **HB 2625**

By: Henke et al of the House and Stanislawski et al of the Senate

This is to advise you that on this date, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 11 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution to approve or object to legislation presented to me, I have VETOED House Bill **2625**.

Current Law and history:

The Reading Sufficiency Act (RSA) was originally passed in 2011 with the goal of ensuring that every third grade child can read before being promoted to fourth grade. Under current law, the RSA encourages early literacy education for our state's elementary school children, requires improved programs of reading instruction, provides for monitoring and assessment of a child's progress in early elementary education, and addresses the failure of social promotions of grade school children with tremendous deficits in reading.

The RSA requires retention of third-graders who score in the unsatisfactory category in the year end reading assessment and who do not fall into one of six (6) good cause exemptions. Good cause exemptions are available for English as a second language students, students with disabilities on individualized education plans (IEP) indicating the student is to be assessed with alternate achievement standards through the Oklahoma Alternate Assessment Program (OAAP), and students with disabilities who participate in statewide criterion-referenced tests, who have an IEP reflecting the student has received intensive remediation in reading for more than two (2) years, who continue to demonstrate a reading deficiency, and who were previously retained.

Additionally, the good cause exemptions include alternative means of evaluating a student's reading level in lieu of the year-end standardized test. These alternative options include a portfolio review of the student's work demonstrating grade-level reading, alternative standardized testing, and successful completion of a summer reading academy. Currently, there are four (4) alternative standardized tests recognized by the State Board of Education available to all students. While retention is a last resort, the RSA ensures that retention is preceded and accompanied by additional interventions.

House Bill 2625 amendments and effects:

House Bill **2625** would amend the RSA by delaying the enforcement of the mandatory third grade retention for the 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 school years. The bill provides for a “probationary promotion” by a “Student reading Proficiency Team” (team) composed of the parents(s) guardian(s) of the student, the teacher assigned to the student who had the responsibility for reading instruction in that academic year, a reading teacher who teaches in the subsequent grade level, the school principal, and a certified reading specialist.

This Bill fails to incorporate *any objective or quantifiable* measures the team must consider. In fact, the team is not required to consider the reading level of the child, nor is the team required to meet in person. The Bill provides simply upon a unanimous vote of the team, a child must be promoted. The bill further provides that students may *continue* to receive probationary promotions, *without regard* to improvements in reading, and *without* consideration of any objective reading standards, so long as the team unanimously approves. This approach, which wholly fails to consider the child’s reading ability, is not supported by research and would erode the purpose of the RSA.

House Bill **2625** severely undermines the intent and goals of the RSA by re-implementing an opportunity for social promotion, which is the practice of promoting a student to the next grade regardless of whether the student learned the necessary material, in order to keep them with their peers by age. An overwhelming amount of research indicates that the third grade is the turning point for the acquisition of reading skills. The research tells us that from kindergarten to third grade, a child learns to read, and from fourth grade on, a child reads to learn. Further, children who do not read proficiently by the end of third grade are four times more likely to leave school without a diploma than proficient readers. When students are socially promoted, students continue to move through the grades while falling further and further behind their peers, leading to dropping out of school or obtaining a meaningless diploma.

Conclusion:

In the first year of the RSA’s full implementation, 15.7 percent or 7,970 children scored “unsatisfactory” on the year-end standardized test. An unsatisfactory score indicates the child is reading at or below a first grade level. Because of great work done by parents, students, and teachers in implementing and following the RSA policies for two years, that number is significantly lower than anticipated.

For the 7,970 children who scored unsatisfactory, if the test does not appropriately reflect the student’s reading ability, he or she may use the alternative means of evaluating the student’s reading level, which include a portfolio review of the student’s work demonstrating grade-level reading, use of one (1) of four (4) alternative standardized test assessments, or completion of a summer reading academy followed by an assessment. Further, some of these students may qualify for one of the good cause exemptions. These exemptions include children who speak English as a second language, students with disabilities on an IEP who are assessed through the OAAP, and students with disabilities who have an IEP, who have previously received two (2) years of intensive remediation, and who were previously retained for one year of kindergarten, first, second, or third grade.

Perhaps most importantly, a significant portion of these 7,970 students *cannot read*. I believe we have to be honest when our children fall behind, focus our attention on them, and teach them to read. Promoting these children to fourth grade without the basic tools they need to succeed is not just unwise, it's immoral. We must ensure our children have basic proficiency in reading before the fourth grade. If we do not, we doom these children to failure. Instead, I want to see them excel, rather than struggle in the classroom, build and gain self confidence, and earn a meaningful high school diploma that will carry them through their future education and endeavors.

Improvements can certainly be made to the RSA to make testing more flexible. For example, a system of periodic assessments would allow students to test early, either during the third grade year, or before, thereby giving students multiple opportunities to demonstrate their reading proficiency. Unfortunately, House Bill **2625** does not implement this type of change, nor does it improve the RSA.

The continued failure of achieving literacy for all Oklahoma children is too steep in economic, social, and human terms for our children and for our State to continue to bear. For all of these reasons, I have vetoed **HB 2625**.
