Announcing the passage of **SBs 24, 50, 62, 109, 145, 219, 220, 231, 261, 340, 434** and **560**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 24 – By Quinn of the Senate and Faught of the House.

An Act relating to state employees; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 840-2.10, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 237, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 840-2.10), which relates to the State Employee Assistance Program; removing requirement for certain training program; abolishing the Employee Assistance Program Advisory Council; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 50 – By Smalley of the Senate and Biggs of the House.

An Act relating to agriculture education; amending Section 1, Chapter 31, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 14-108.2), which relates to agricultural education programs; modifying reference to grades in which programs can be offered; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 62 – By Stanislawski of the Senate and ODonnell of the House.

An Act relating to laser pointers; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1992, which relates to the “Laser Safety Act”; prohibiting the pointing of laser pointers at aircraft; providing penalties; providing exceptions; modifying definitions; and providing an effective date.

SB 109 – By Anderson of the Senate and Rousselot of the House.

An Act relating to durable powers of attorney; amending 58 O.S. 2011, Sections 1074 and 1075, which relate to relationship of court-appointed fiduciary and attorney-in-fact and incapacity of principal; modifying authority of certain fiduciary; modifying certain termination procedures; requiring filing of certain notice; allowing reliance on certain authority prior to filing of certain notice; and providing an effective date.

SB 145 – By Standridge and Sharp of the Senate and Griffith of the House.

An Act relating to memorial highway designations; designating the Sgt. Daniel M. Eshbaugh Memorial Highway; requiring certain markers; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 219 – By Brooks of the Senate and Roberts (Sean) of the House.

An Act relating to off-duty police officers; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1289.23, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2013 (21 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 1289.23), which relates to concealed firearms for off-duty police officers; modifying certain requirements; and providing an effective date.

SB 220 – By Brooks of the Senate and Roberts (Sean) of the House.

[law enforcement training - Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training - reserve academy certification requirements and training - effective date]

SB 231 – By Smalley of the Senate and Echols of the House.

[executors of estates - actions - certain agreements - effective date]

SB 261 – By Sharp of the Senate and Echols of the House.

[termination of parental rights - jury trial - failure to appear - notice - burden of proof - effective date]

SB 340 – By Stanislawski of the Senate and Mulready of the House.

An Act relating to insurance; amending 36 O.S. 2011, Section 607.1, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 39, O.S.L. 2014 (36 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 607.1), which relates to Interlocal Entities; modifying contents of and requirements for annual audited financial reports; requiring and prescribing requirements for certain actuarial opinions; defining term; modifying circumstances under which extension of filing date may be granted; specifying requirements for Interlocal Entities insuring educational institutions; modifying circumstances in which fine may be assessed; requiring certain documents be open to public inspection; and providing an effective date.

SB 434 – By Floyd and Pittman of the Senate and Echols of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Chiropractic Practice Act; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Sections 161.6, as amended by Section 15, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2012 and 161.7 (59 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 161.6), which relate to powers of the Board and Licensing; modifying powers of the Board; establishing certain procedure for complaints and investigations; making certain information confidential; providing certain exceptions; authorizing respondent to acquire certain information for certain purpose; requiring international applicants to possess certain credentials; requiring submission of certain documents; directing Board to issue licenses to certain applicants; and providing an effective date.

SB 560 – By Standridge of the Senate and Derby of the House.

An Act relating to health care; creating the Health Care Empowerment Act; providing short title; prohibiting certain construction of state laws; providing that insurance benefits not forfeited by certain purchases; providing that certain products and services not deemed offer of insurance; requiring certain disclosure; defining terms; providing that direct primary care membership agreement not considered insurance and not subject to certain provisions; providing that direct primary care provider or agent not required to obtain certain credentials; stating certain requirements for direct primary care membership agreement; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.
