“Christ Died for All
2 Corinthians 5:14-15

For the love of Christ compels us, because we judge thus: that if One died for all, then all died; and He died for all, that those who live should live no longer for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again.

Esther 4:13-14

And Mordecai told them to answer Esther: ‘Do not think in your heart that you will escape in the king's palace any more than all the other Jews. For if you remain completely silent at this time, relief and deliverance will arise for the Jews from another place, but you and your father's house will perish. Yet who knows whether you have come to the kingdom for such a time as this?’

It has been an interesting two weeks for me. I substitute as a teacher in one of the local schools and in the schools when they ask them to stand to salute the flag, many of them refuse. Yet, here in these chambers, there is enthusiasm in saluting the flag.

Both my dad and step-father served this country and retired from the Navy and Air Force, respectively. For me this is still the best country to live in; yet there are many problems in this state and nation. What is the reason so many young people are leaving this country to become trained terrorists against this nation?

I am grieved when one man who has been charged with an offense can still go on a thirty-day vacation out of the country and another charged with a lesser crime cannot leave the country. I am grieved when a mother can lose her six-year- old son because of a man

driving up the off-ramp of the turnpike and nothing is said and he is allowed to go about his life as usual. I am grieved when our teachers are paid far less than other teachers in other states and when all of our students are not given the same learning tools to be as successful as other students.

Twenty-seven years and three months ago, I was elected Pastor of Greater Mt. Carmel Baptist Church. There were those who wanted me to know that they voted for me. Well, the truth is it was God who determined that I would serve as Pastor of this church. Equally, you have people in your district that believe they put you in office, when in fact it was God alone who determined that you would sit in this chamber for such a time as this.

Each of you are accountable to God for every decision you make that blesses one group of people while hurting another group of people. As elected officials you must remember that Christ died for you and for all people. Therefore, you must die to yourself and live for Christ so that people are pointed to Christ.

God has selected you at such a time as this to provide leadership that will protect the unprotected of this state and all people for whom Christ died. You are not accountable to the people in your district as much as you are accountable to God Almighty who selected you to serve.

Years ago I thought I wanted to be in politics. Not anymore! However, I find myself praying greatly for each of you. This week I have prayed for you, your spouses, your children, and your pastors because your task is very difficult. Working out bills that benefit each resident without hurting others is the call God has given each of you for such a time as this.

Let us stand and pray.”
