A public school or school district shall not be a member of any school athletic association as defined in Section 27-102 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes unless that association has adopted a written policy that grants a waiver to the eligibility rules of the association for students who have been required to transfer or change schools as a result of the state agency having legal custody of the student changing the foster family home of the student.” and by renumbering the subsequent section, which amendment was withdrawn.
