An Act relating to insurance; amending 36 O.S. 2011, Sections 6124.1 and 7106, which relate to prepaid funeral benefit permits and annual reports; authorizing the transfer of benefits to Insurance Commissioner in certain circumstances; amending 36 O.S. 2011, Section 7102, as amended by Section 17, Chapter 269, O.S.L. 2013 (36 O.S.
