

# HOUSE JOURNAL

**Second Regular Session of the Fifty-fifth Legislature**

**of the State of Oklahoma**

**Fifty-second Legislative Day, Tuesday, May 3, 2016**

The House was called to order by Representative Thomsen.

The roll was called with 99 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Enns, Shelton.—2.

Representative Thomsen declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Associate Pastor Daniel Hayes, Unity Missionary Baptist Church, Duncan. Pastor Hayes was sponsored by Representative Johnson.
