“SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1289.31 of Title 21, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

“Oklahoma Army and Air National Guard personnel may carry a firearm on his or her person while in uniform and in a duty status throughout the State of Oklahoma if the person

has successfully completed an approved course of firearms training conducted by or designated by the Adjutant General which is equal to the minimum requirements for firearms training as set forth by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training.”,

which amendment was declared adopted.
