COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 1521 — By LEFTWICH
of the Senate and NANCE of the House.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 904, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 133, O.S.L. 2002 (47 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 904), which relates to payment of cost of removal and storage; authorizing operators to collect fees from certain persons for performance of services; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 953.1, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 360, O.S.L. 2004 (47 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 953.1), which relates to fees and charges; authorizing wrecker operators to obtain certain ownership information from agencies; requiring certain agencies to assist in obtaining ownership information; authorizing operators to collect fees from certain persons for performance of services; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 962, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 214, O.S.L. 2003 (47 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 962), which relates to liens and foreclosures; authorizing wrecker or towing service to collect certain fee from certain owner; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 904, as amended by Section 2,
2 Chapter 133, O.S.L. 2002 (47 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 904), is amended to read as follows:
3 Section 904. The owner of a motor vehicle or lienholder of the vehicle abandoned in vi-
4 olation of Section 901 et seq. of this title, or the owner of any vehicle or lienholder of the ve-
5 hicle or insurer accepting liability for paying a claim on a vehicle or purchasing the vehicle
6 as a total loss vehicle from the registered owner which shall have been lawfully removed

1 from any highway or other public property may regain possession of the vehicle in accor-
2 dance with regulations of the Department of Public Safety upon payment of the reasonable
3 cost of removal and storage of such vehicle. The operator is authorized to collect all lawful
4 fees from the owner, lienholder that seeks possession of a vehicle under a security interest,
5 agent, or insurer accepting liability for paying the claim for a vehicle or purchasing the ve-
6 hicle as a total loss vehicle from the registered owner of the towed vehicle for the perfor-
7 mance of any and all such services. An operator shall release the vehicle from storage upon
8 authorization from the owner, agent or lienholder of the vehicle or in the case of a total loss,
9 the insurer accepting liability for paying the claim on the vehicle or purchasing the vehicle
10 where the vehicle is to be moved to an insurance pool yard for sale.

11 The cost of removal and storage shall be paid to the wrecker or towing service.

12 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 953.1, as last amended by Section 2,
13 Chapter 360, O.S.L. 2004 (47 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 953.1), is amended to read as follows:

14 Section 953.1 A. The rates and provisions of this section shall apply only to determine
15 the maximum fees and charges for wrecker or towing services performed in this state, in-
16 cluding incorporated and unincorporated areas, by a wrecker or towing service licensed by
17 the Department of Public Safety when that service appears on the rotation log of the De-
18 partment or on the rotation log of any municipality, county or other political subdivision of
19 this state, and the services performed are at the request or at the direction of any officer of
20 the Department or of a municipality, county, or political subdivision. No wrecker or towing
21 service in the performance of these services shall charge any fee which exceeds the maxi-
22 mum rates established in this section, adjusted as provided in subsection H of this section.

1 Such rates shall be in addition to any other rates, fees or charges authorized or required by
2 law. Any wrecker or towing service is authorized to collect from the owner, lienholder, agent
3 or insurer accepting liability for paying the claim for a vehicle or purchasing the vehicle as
4 a total loss vehicle from the registered owner of any towed or stored vehicle, the fee re-
5 quired by Section 904 of this title.

6 B. When wrecker or towing services are performed as provided in subsection A of this
7 section:

8 1. Each performance of a wrecker or towing service shall be recorded by the operator
9 on a bill or invoice as prescribed by rules of the Department;

10 2. Nothing herein shall limit the right of an operator who has provided or caused to be
11 provided wrecker or towing services to require prepayment, in part or in full, or guarantee
12 of payment of any charges incurred for providing such services;

13 3. This section shall not be construed to require an operator to charge a fee for the per-
14 formance of any wrecker or towing services; and

15 4. The operator is authorized to collect all lawful fees from the owner, lienholder or
16 agent or insurer accepting liability for paying the claim for a vehicle or purchasing the ve-
17 hicle as a total loss vehicle from the registered owner of the towed vehicle for the perfor-
18 mance of any and all such services. An operator shall release the vehicle from storage upon
19 authorization from the owner, agent or lienholder of the vehicle or, in the case of a total loss,
20 the insurer accepting liability for paying the claim for the vehicle or purchasing the vehicle
21 where the vehicle is to be moved to an insurance pool yard for sale.

22 C. Distance rates.

1 1. Rates in this subsection shall apply to the distance the towed vehicle is transported
2 and shall include services of the operator of the wrecker vehicle. Hourly rates, as provided
3 in subsection D of this section, may be applied in lieu of distance rates. Hourly rates may be
4 applied from the time the wrecker vehicle is assigned to the service call until the time it is
5 released from service either upon return to the premises of the wrecker or towing service or
6 upon being assigned to perform another wrecker or towing service, whichever occurs first.
7 When the hourly rate is applied in lieu of distance towing rates, the operator may not apply
8 the two-hour minimum prescribed in subsection D of this section nor may hookup or
9 mileage charges, as prescribed in this section, be applied.

10 Such distance rates shall be computed via the shortest highway mileage as determined
11 from the latest official Oklahoma Department of Transportation state highway map, except
12 as follows:

- 13 a. for distances or portions of distances not specifically provided for in the
14 governing highway map, the actual mileage via the shortest practical route
15 will apply,
- 16 b. in computing distances, fractions of a mile will be retained until the final
17 and full mileage is determined, at which time any remaining fraction shall
18 be increased to the next whole mile,
- 19 c. when, due to circumstances beyond the control of the wrecker or towing ser-
20 vice, roadway conditions make it impractical to travel via the shortest route,
21 distance rates shall be computed based on the shortest practical route over
22 which the wrecker vehicle and the vehicle it is towing can be moved, which

1 route shall be noted on the bill or invoice, or
 2 d. when the wrecker or towing service is performed upon any turnpike or toll
 3 road, the turnpike or toll road mileage shall be used to determine the dis-
 4 tance rates charged and the turnpike or toll road fees may be added to the
 5 bill or invoice.

6 2. Maximum distance rates shall be as follows:

14 Single vehicle: 12,001 to 40,000	Any	\$5.75

16 Combination of vehicles	Any	\$6.75

17 D. Hourly Rates.

18 1. Rates in this subsection shall apply for the use of a wrecker vehicle and shall in-
 19 clude services of the operator of such wrecker, except as provided in paragraph 4 of this
 20 subsection. Rates shall apply for all wrecker or towing services performed that are not oth-
 21 erwise provided for in this section, including, but not limited to, waiting and standby time,
 22 but shall not include the first fifteen (15) minutes of service following the hookup of a vehi-

1 cle when a hookup fee is assessed, as provided in subsection E of this section.

2 Hourly rates shall apply from the time the vehicle or labor is assigned to the service
3 call until the time it is released from service either upon return to the premises of the
4 wrecker or towing service or upon being assigned to perform another wrecker or towing ser-
5 vice, whichever occurs first. Whenever a wrecker vehicle is used to tow a vehicle subject to
6 distance rates, as provided in subsection C of this section, hourly rates shall apply only for
7 the time such wrecker is used in the performance of services other than transportation, ex-
8 cept when such hourly rates are used in lieu of such distance rates.

9 As used in this subsection, rates stated per hour apply for whole hours and, for frac-
10 tions of an hour, rates stated per fifteen (15) minutes apply for each fifteen (15) minutes or
11 fraction thereof over seven and one-half (7 1/2) minutes. However, if the service subject to an
12 hourly rate is performed in less than two (2) hours, the charge applicable for two (2) hours
13 may be assessed, except as provided for in subsection C of this section.

14 2. Maximum hourly rates for wrecker or towing services performed for passenger vehi-
15 cles, when rates for such services are not otherwise provided for by law, shall be as follows:

18 Single vehicle: 8,000 or less	\$60.00	\$15.00
19 Single vehicle: 8,001 to 24,000	\$80.00	\$20.00

21 Single vehicle: 44,001 or over	\$180.00	\$45.00
22 Combination of vehicles	\$180.00	\$45.00

1 3. Maximum hourly rates for all other wrecker or towing services, when rates for such
2 other services are not otherwise provided for by law, shall be determined based upon the
3 gross vehicle weight rating of each wrecker vehicle used as follows:

4 GVWR of Wrecker Vehicle	Rate Per	Rate Per
5 (In pounds)	Hour	15 Minutes
6 8,000 or less	\$60.00	\$15.00
7 8,001 to 24,000	\$80.00	\$20.00
8 24,001 to 44,000	\$120.00	\$30.00

10 Combination wrecker vehicle

11 with GVWR of 24,000 or over \$180.00 \$45.00

12 4. a. Maximum hourly rates for extra labor shall be Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) per
13 person per hour.

14 b. Maximum hourly rates for skilled or specialized labor and/or equipment
15 shall be the actual customary and ordinary rates charged for such labor
16 and/or equipment. When skilled or specialized labor or equipment is re-
17 quired, the wrecker operator's cost for such skilled or specialized labor or
18 equipment plus a twenty-five percent (25%) gross profit markup to cover
19 overhead costs for such labor will be added to the invoice or freight bill to
20 be collected in addition to all other applicable charges.

21 E. Hookup Rates.

22 1. Rates in this subsection shall apply to the hookup of a vehicle to a wrecker vehicle

1 when such hookup is performed in connection with a wrecker or towing service described in
2 this section. Such hookup rate shall include the first fifteen (15) minutes of such service, for
3 which there shall be no additional fee charged, but shall not include the use of a dolly or
4 rollback equipment or a combination wrecker vehicle to accomplish such hookup, for
5 which an additional fee may be charged as provided in subsection F of this section. Hookup
6 shall include, but not be limited to, the attachment of a vehicle to or the loading of a vehicle
7 onto a wrecker vehicle.

8 2. Maximum hookup rates shall be as follows:

9 Weight of Vehicle Being Hooked Up

10 (In pounds, including equipment	Rate
11 and lading)	
12 Single vehicle: 8,000 or less	\$65.00
13 Single vehicle: 8,001 to 12,000	\$75.00
14 Single vehicle: 12,001 to 24,000	\$85.00
15 Single vehicle: 24,001 or over	\$95.00
16 Combination of vehicles	\$95.00

17 F. Additional Service Rates.

18 1. Rates in this subsection shall apply to the performance of the following services:

- 19** a. the disconnection and reconnection of a towed vehicle's drive line when
- 20** necessary to prevent mechanical damage to such vehicle,
- 21** b. the removal and replacement of a towed vehicle's axle when necessary to
- 22** prevent mechanical damage to such vehicle, or

1 c. the use of a dolly or rollback equipment when essential to prevent mechan-
 2 ical damage to a towed vehicle or when neither end of such vehicle is capa-
 3 ble of being towed safely while in contact with the roadway.

4 2. Maximum additional service rates shall be as follows:

14 G. An operator shall be required to provide reasonable documentation to substantiate
 15 all lawful fees charged the owner, lienholder, agent or insurer paying the claim for the
 16 towed vehicle. Fees for which the operator is being reimbursed or having paid to a third
 17 party, shall include copies of the invoice or other appropriate documents to substantiate
 18 such payment to said third party.

19 H. Wrecker fees, including maximum distance, hourly, and hookup rates shall be ad-
 20 justed weekly by the Department of Public Safety by adding a fuel surcharge as provided in
 21 this section. The Department shall base the surcharge on the Department of Energy “week-
 22 ly retail on-highway diesel prices” for the “Midwest region” using One Dollar and ninety

1 cents (\$1.90) per gallon as the base price with no fees added. The wrecker fees shall be ad-
2 justed to allow a one-percent increase in fees for every ten-cent increase in fuel cost start-
3 ing at Two Dollars (\$2.00) per gallon.

4 I. Wrecker operators shall be allowed to obtain ownership and insurer information
5 from the Oklahoma Tax Commission or other state's motor vehicle agencies for the purpose
6 of determining ownership and responsibility for wrecker fees. In the event a state of origin is
7 not known, the Department of Public Safety and the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall assist in
8 providing such information. The wrecker operator is authorized to collect lawful fees for such
9 costs and services from the owner, lienholder that seeks possession of a vehicle under a secu-
10 arity interest, agent, or insurer accepting liability for paying the claim for a vehicle or pur-
11 chasing the vehicle as a total loss vehicle from the owner of any towed or stored vehicle.

12 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 962, as amended by Section 2,
13 Chapter 214, O.S.L. 2003 (47 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 962), is amended to read as follows:

14 Section 962. A. Every person legally entitled to compensation for the removal or stor-
15 age of any vehicle subject to registration, which vehicle's removal has been authorized by
16 any public agency, has a lien on the vehicle, dependent on possession. The lien is deemed to
17 arise on the date of possession of the vehicle. Any person perfecting a lien under this sec-
18 tion shall foreclose this lien according to the provisions for sale under Sections 908 through
19 911 of this title.

20 B. Every owner of such vehicle towed or stored pursuant to Section 955 of this title
21 shall be responsible for the total amount of the debt for services rendered.

22 C. Any wrecker or towing service is authorized to collect from the owner, lienholder

1 that seeks possession of a vehicle under a security interest, agent, or insurer accepting lia-
2 bility for paying the claim for a vehicle or purchasing the vehicle as a total loss vehicle, the
3 fee authorized by Section 904 of this title.

4 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
5 health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall
6 take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
