

# House District 66 | Rep. Jadine Nollan

**HD 66** had **37,086** people when it was redistricted in 2011. The target population at that time was **37,142** people per House District.

Now it has an estimated **36,850** people, according to the latest numbers from the American Community Survey, a program of the U.S. Census Bureau.

The current estimate is **-2,089** away from the estimated district target of **38,939** people, which is determined by dividing our estimated statewide population (3,932,870) by the 101 House Districts.

The district's population has changed an estimated **-0.64%** between 2010 and now.

86.5% of the district is White, alone or in combination with one or more other races.  
4.6% of the district is Black or African American, alone or in combination with one or more other races.

14.3% of the district is American Indian and Alaskan Native, alone or in combination with one or more other races.

1.1% of the district is Asian, alone or in combination with one or more other races.

0.1% of the district is Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, alone or in combination with one or more other races.

1.5% of the district is some other race.

6.2% of the district is of Hispanic or Latino origin.

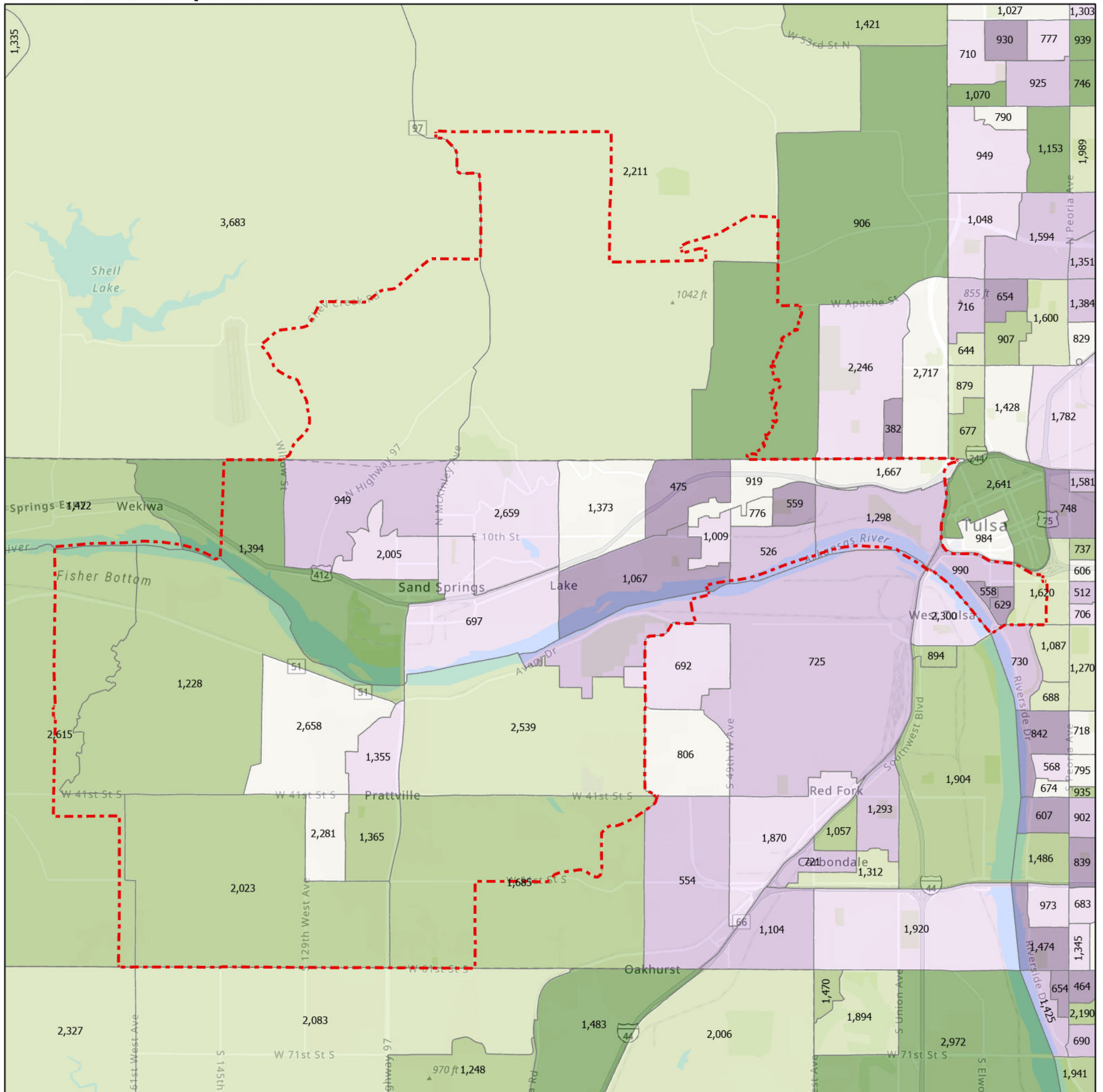
