

House District 9 | Rep. Mark Lepak

HD 9 had **37,325** people when it was redistricted in 2011. The target population at that time was **37,142** people per House District.

Now it has an estimated **38,536** people, according to the latest numbers from the American Community Survey, a program of the U.S. Census Bureau.

The current estimate is **-403** away from the estimated district target of **38,939** people, which is determined by dividing our estimated statewide population (3,932,870) by the 101 House Districts.

The district's population has changed an estimated **3.24%** between 2010 and now.

- 81% of the district is White, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 2.3% of the district is Black or African American, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 23.4% of the district is American Indian and Alaskan Native, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 1.4% of the district is Asian, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 0% of the district is Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 1.7% of the district is some other race.
- 5.6% of the district is of Hispanic or Latino origin.

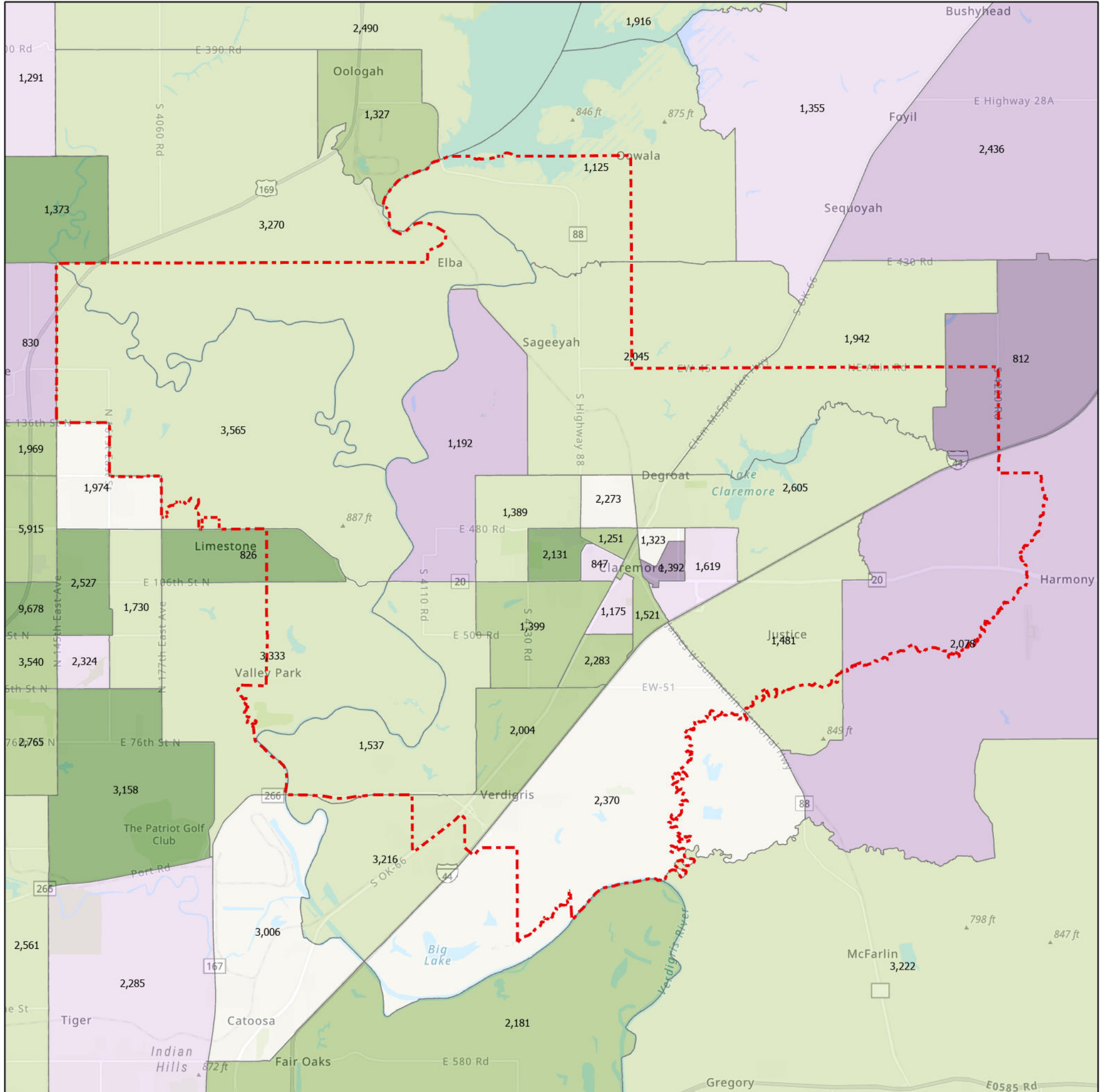
