House District 99 | Rep. Ajay Pittman

HD 99 had 37,417 people when it was redistricted in 2011. The target population at that time was 37,142 people per House District.

Now it has an estimated 40,627 people, according to the latest numbers from the American Community Survey, a program of the U.S. Census Bureau.

The current estimate is 1,688 away from the estimated district target of 38,939 people, which is determined by dividing our estimated statewide population (3,932,870) by the 101 House Districts.

The district's population has changed an estimated 8.58% between 2010 and now.

39% of the district is White, alone or in combination with one or more other races. 56% of the district is Black or African American, alone or in combination with one or more other races.

6.5% of the district is American Indian and Alaskan Native, alone or in combination with one or more other races.

3.5% of the district is Asian, alone or in combination with one or more other races. 0.4% of the district is Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, alone or in

combination with one or more other races. 2.8% of the district is some other race.


