Thirty-sixth Legislative Day, Tuesday, April 6, 2021

HB 2943 – By McCall of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to higher education; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3213, as amended by Section 627, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 and Section 1, Chapter 252, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp. 2020, Sections 3213 and 3213.2), which relate to the University Center of Southern Oklahoma; renaming University Center of Southern Oklahoma; transferring control of certain funds and accounts; designating the Board of Regents of Murray State College as the administrative agency; dissolving certain board of trustees; updating references to name; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3407.2, which relates to the Board of Regents of Murray State College; updating Board name; modifying membership of the Board; transferring the University Center of Southern Oklahoma to Murray State College; listing items included in the transfer; transferring title to buildings, improvements and real property; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.
